He previously served as project director for the Here to Career program, supported by a Title V grant from the U.S. Department of Education. Another joint effort between CSUSB, Norco College and San Bernardino Valley College, the program served and expanded limited institutional resources for Hispanic and low-income students through education promotion, career readiness and problem-based learning activities.

Dr. Heisterkamp has authored several publications and given numerous nationwide conference presentations on language and social interaction, conflict management and mediation. He has a doctoral degree in Communication from Arizona State University. Additionally, he is a member of the Western States Communication Association, a membership organization with over 1,000 members, and previously served as president in 2018.
