Dear Colleagues,

Following a national search and carefully considering input from the campus community, I am pleased to announce that Dr. Kelly Campbell has been named vice provost of Academic Affairs and co-chief diversity officer on the President's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion board. She will hold a tenured academic appointment in the Department of Psychology.

Among her responsibilities, she will oversee the Offices of Academic Programs, Academic Research, Academic Success and Undergraduate Advising, Community Engagement, Graduate Studies and CSUSB Libraries. She will also oversee assessment for the division and work with the university's cross-divisional assessment team.

Dr. Campbell, the recipient of the university's 2020-21 Golden Apple Award and several other honors, brings a wealth of experience to the position. Most recently, she served nearly 18 months as interim vice provost of Academic Affairs. Among her numerous outstanding accomplishments, she provided leadership and oversight for a 65-member task force of students, staff, faculty and administrators to develop the 2023-2028 university strategic plan, co-led CSUSB's collaborations with Growing Inland Achievement and the Gardner Institute to address key institutional priorities, secured external funding and executed interventions across 28 courses to promote equitable learning practices and close equity gaps, and founded the Growing Leadership Opportunities for Women (GLOW) group of over 125 staff, faculty and administrators dedicated to championing women's leadership at CSUSB.

Previous leadership roles at our campus include associate director of the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences' Institute for Child Development and Family Relations, director of the Honors Program in the Department of Psychology and advisor for the Psi Chi International Honor Society. A nationally recognized relationships expert, Dr. Campbell has given dozens of invited lectures, supervised more than 40 theses, presented at nearly 120 conferences, published over 35 peer-reviewed scholarly works and served five years as a radio show host for "Let's Talk Relationships" on Coyote Radio. She received her Ph.D. in child and family development, with a specialty in interpersonal relations, from the University of Georgia.

Thank you to the campus community for engaging in this important search and to the search committee chair, Dean Rebeccas Lubas, and committee members for your time and efforts throughout this process.

Please join me in congratulating Kelly on her new position. I am confident she will continue to be an asset to the Academic Affairs team, the university, and our community and educational partners.
