Robbery (Strong Arm)

Details:

On Dec 6, 2015 at approximately 9:00 pm a(n) Strong Arm Robbery occurred on the campus of California State University San Bernardino.

This crime occurred at Parking Lot at University Village, 1577 Northpark Blvd.

The victim of the crime was a student of the University.

Suspect/s and/or Vehicle/s Information:

INCIDENT #1 - On Tuesday, 12/1/15, at approximately 9:30 p.m., a strong arm robbery (no weapon involved) occurred near campus in the 1500 block of Northpark Blvd. The victim was walking on the sidewalk east from University Village when she was approached by a suspect described as an adult black male approximately 6'1" 150 lbs. wearing a black sweatshirt, black pants and black shoes. When the suspect got close to her he pushed the victim to the ground and took her gym bag. He then ran away westbound on Northpark Blvd. Report taken by San Bernardino Police Department.

INCIDENT #2 - On Sunday, 12/6/15 at approximately 9:00 p.m., a strong arm robbery (no weapon involved) occurred in the front of the parking lot of University Village. The victims had returned from the businesses at University/Kendall and were followed by three male blacks, 20-25 years old, medium height and weight, one wearing a red hooded sweatshirt, one wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, and the third wearing a hat. As they were walking through the parking lot they were approached by the suspects who demanded their belongings and pulled the victims purse from her shoulder. The suspect then ran through the wash area adjacent to the complex.
