




### FTF Graduation

Sophomores (2016 FTF)	Contact 2nd year students who are on track for graduation in four years to complete an academic plan to stay on track	Quarterly	F 17 - 12/18 W 18 - 3/28 Sp 18 - 6/27	Mass email the students who are still on track for graduation in four years after grades are posted for the term to invite them to come in for an academic plan so they can stay on track for graduation in four years.
Juniors (2015 FTF & 2017 Transfer cohorts)	Contact students in the junior cohorts who are not on track for graduation (those not at junior standing, aren't taking classes towards their major, have a low/borderline GPA, etc.) to encourage them to come in to do a Grad Plan	Quarterly	F 17 - 12/19 W 18 - 4/3 Sp 18 - 6/26	Email students not on track based on units completed at the end of quarter after grades are posted to provide resources and invite them to advising
Seniors (2014 FTF & 2016 Transfer cohorts and those with 135+ units without a GC on file)	Contact senior cohorts and those with 135+ units who do not have a Grad Check on file to give them information about filing their Grad Check and invite them to Grad Check Workshops.	Quarterly	F 17 - 9/25 W 18 - 1/5 Sp 18 - 4/2	Mass email to students to provide information about Grad Checks, deadlines, fees, and workshop, and to invite students to come in for a Graduation Plan.

## Advising Levels



- Paraprofessional/Peer Advisors (Level I):
  - Creating academic plans with students
  - Assisting students with class selection for following term
  - Informing students about academic policies, procedures and paperwork as it pertains to advising and registration
  - Referring to academic, career and student services as necessary
- Professional Advisors (Level II):
  - Able to do all functions of Level I plus
  - Assist students with major exploration and planning
  - Work with students in regards to graduate/professional school pre-requisite requirements
  - Guide student learning and the utilization of student success resources (such as SI, tutoring, mentoring and etc.)
  - Assess students academic and emotional well being and refer accordingly
  - Guide student academic advancement and degree completion
- Professional Advising Mentors (Level III):
  - Able to do all functions of Level I & II plus
  - Identify strengths and areas for professional advisor development
  - Inform curriculum around advising professional development and learning communities
  - Guide the conversations around advisor hiring, training, supervision and evaluation
- Faculty Advisors:
  - Able to do all functions of Level I & II plus
  - Clarify precise content of courses that are discipline specific
  - Provide more in-depth career conversations that are focused and discipline specific
  - Highlight contributions of advising to teaching and learning as appropriate

### GI 2025 Administrative Procedures



- Timely Graduation
  - Declaring a Major (90 units) and Changing Major (120% quarter limit)
- Course repeats restriction
  - Change from 24 units to 18 units for grade forgiveness, 3 attempts to 2 attempts (3<sup>rd</sup> with Dean approval)
- Maximum allowable units per term
  - Change from 17 units and 19.5 for seniors...to 20 units
- Student Orientation Advising and Registration (SOAR)
  - Major explorer, PAWS, Roadmap/Schedule, myCap, Scheduler, Registration
- Early Start/Coyote First Step (CFS)
  - Start GE Stretch Math in Summer, Consider Category E Early Start Course
- Summer Enrollment
  - Culture of students taking 1-2 classes per summer, focusing on GE and core Major courses
- Limits on use of academic registration holds
- Limits on concentrations/minors/certificates that overlap in content
- Deadline for academic changes after conferral of degree
- Priority Registration
