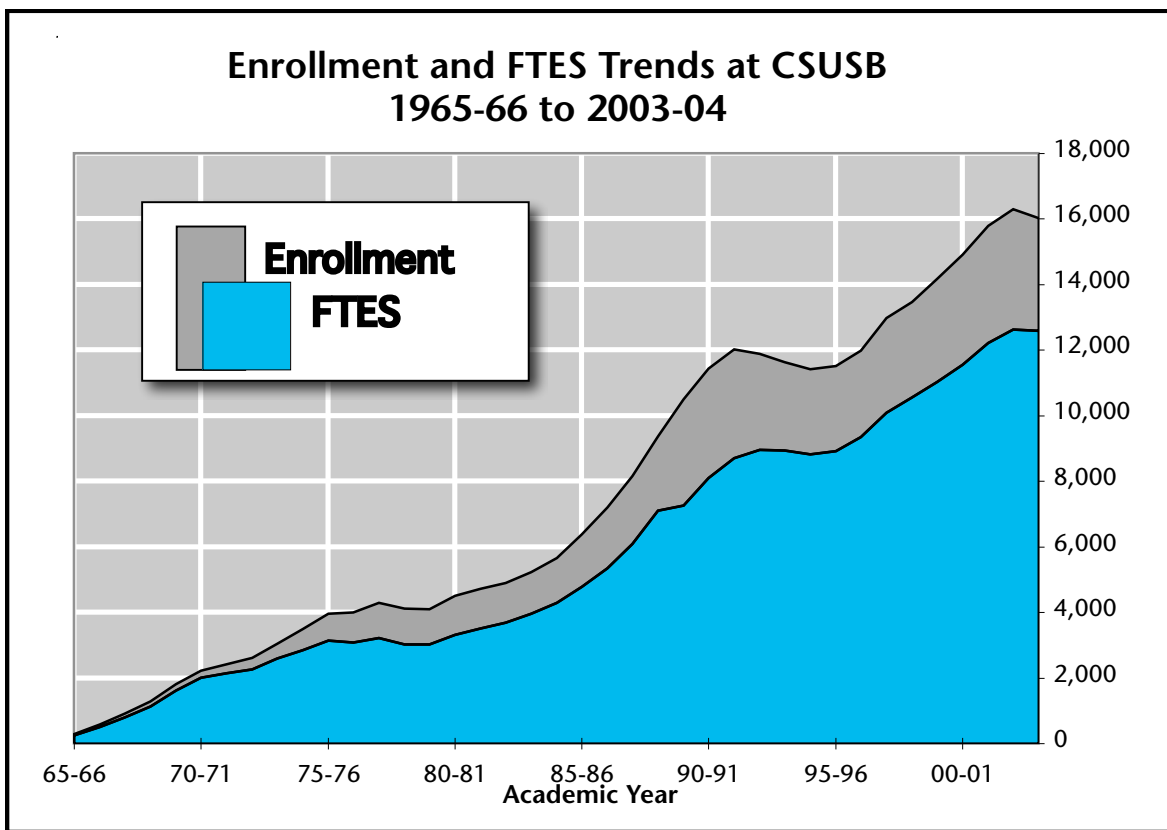

- A comprehensive Microsoft Excel™ version consisting of several workbooks that contain the tables published here as well as the capability to easily generate customized reports that are not feasible for inclusion in a Factbook for general audiences. 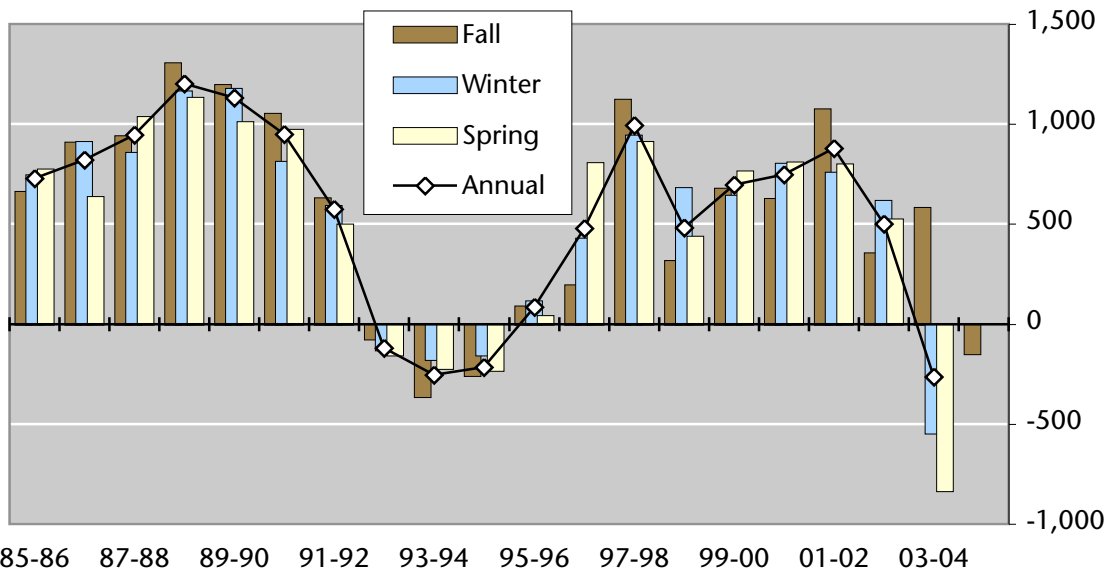

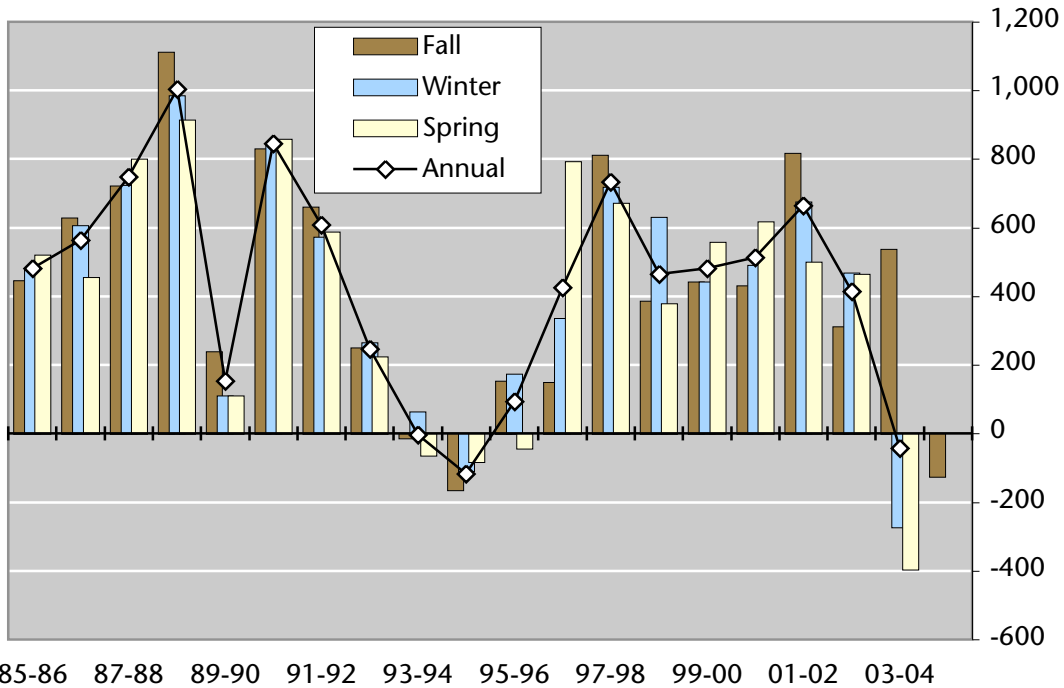
Absolute Change in Enrollment from Previous Year

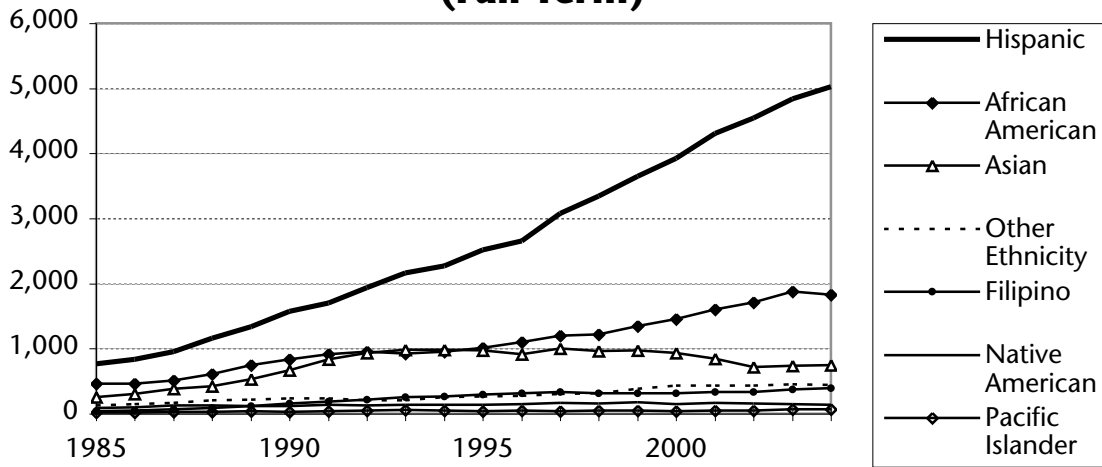

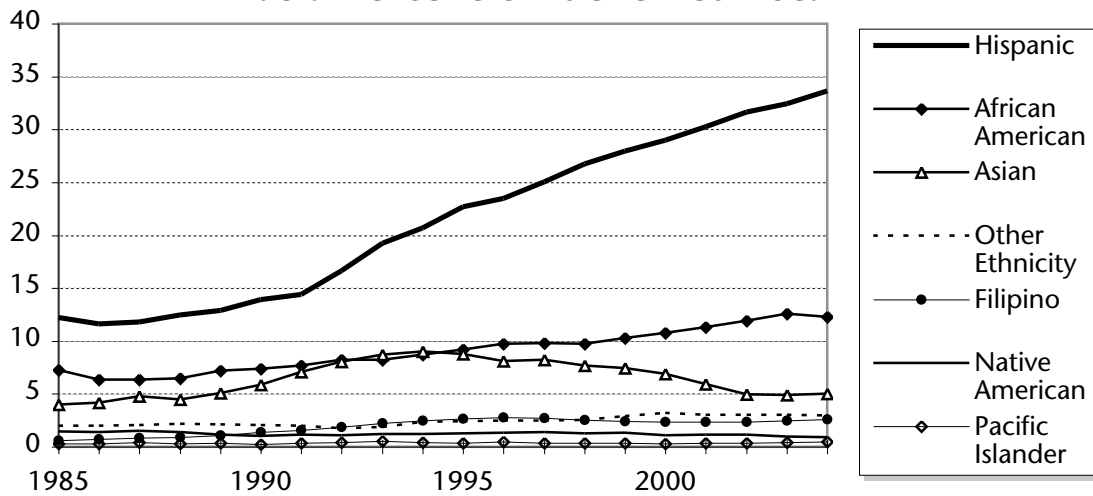
