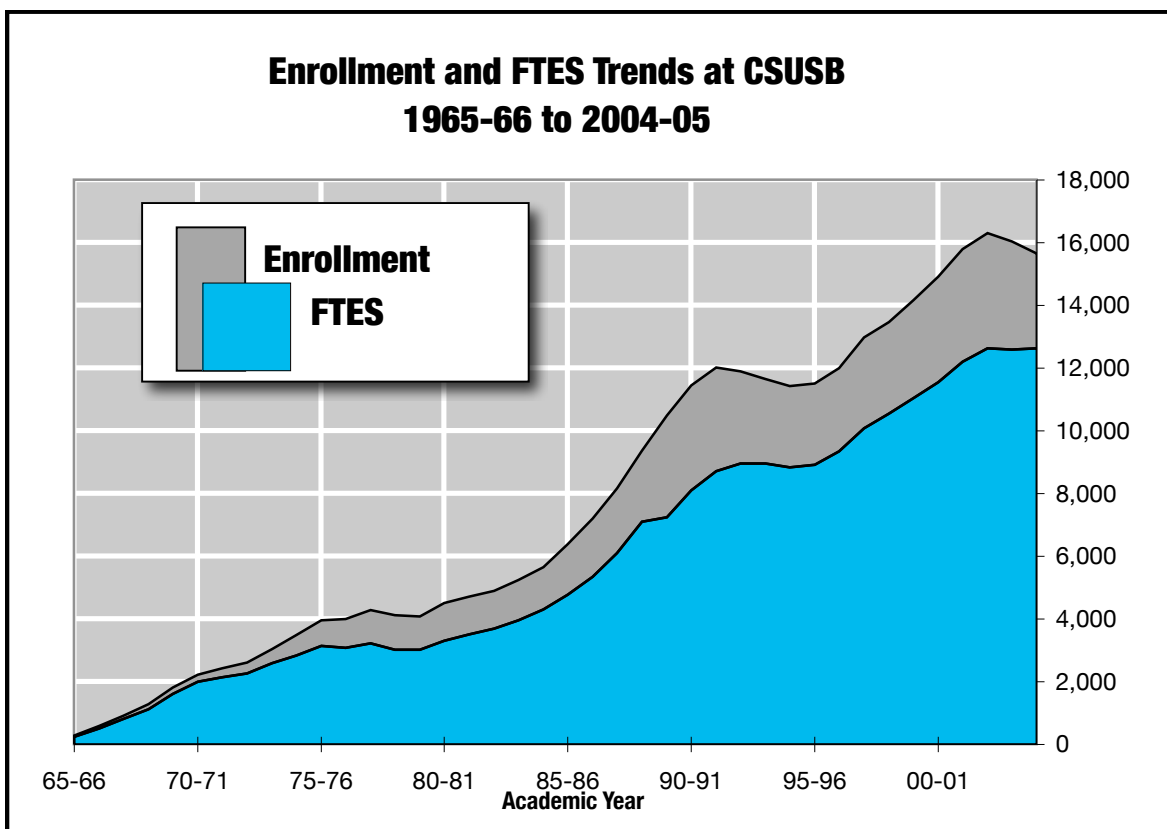

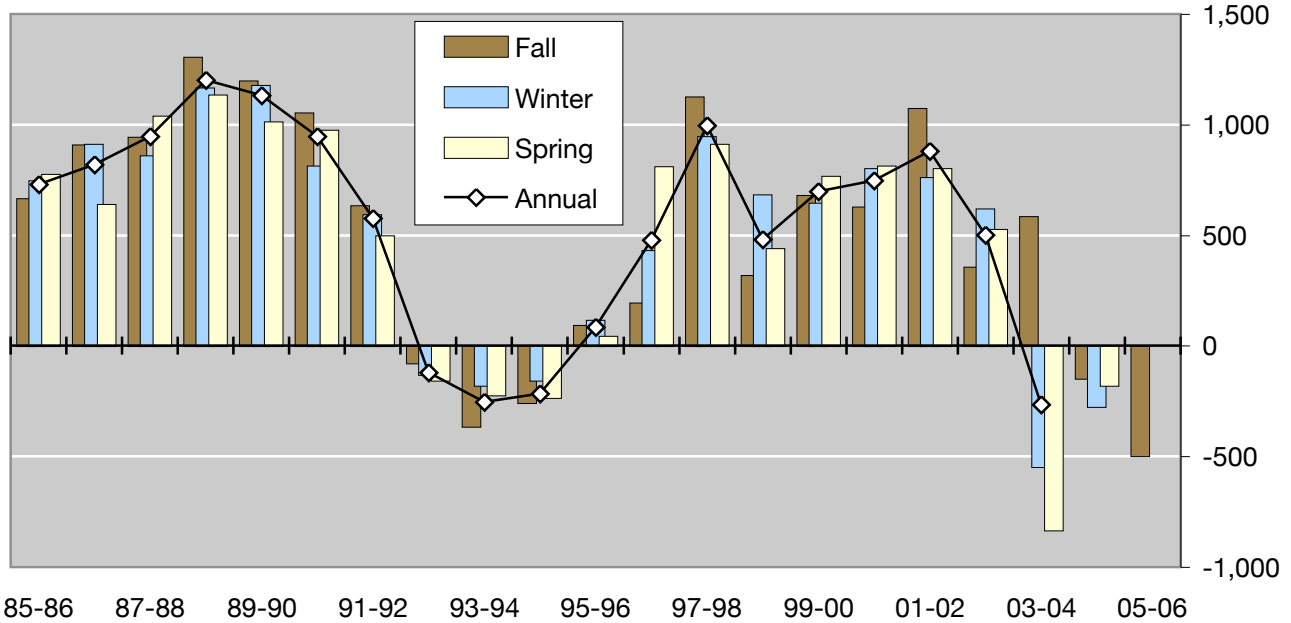

#### Absolute Change in Enrollment from Previous Year

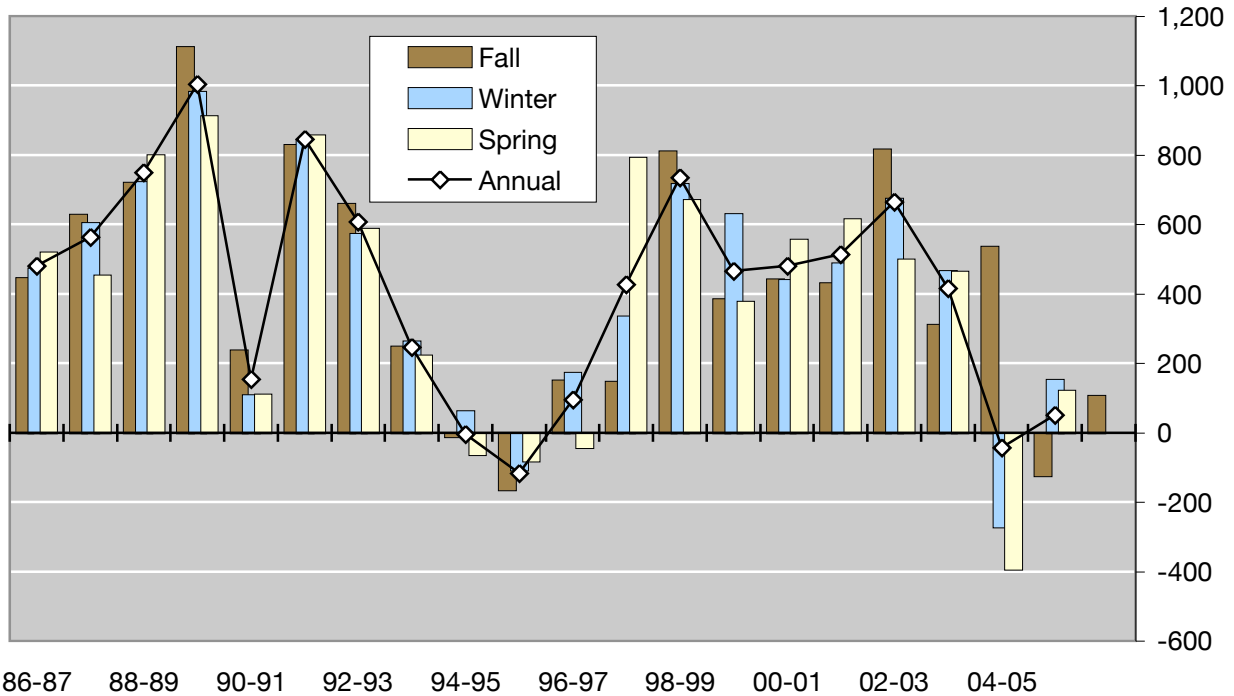

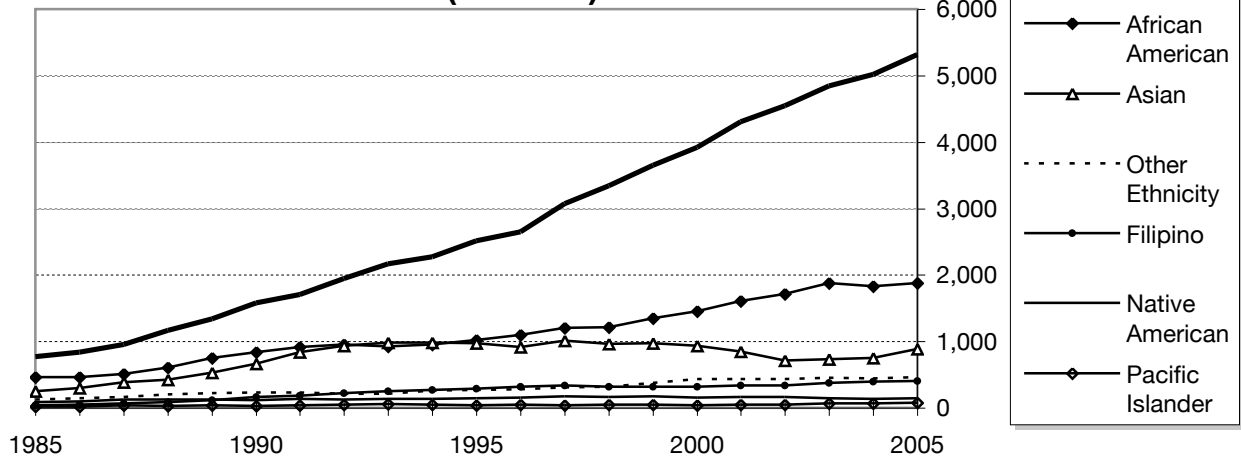

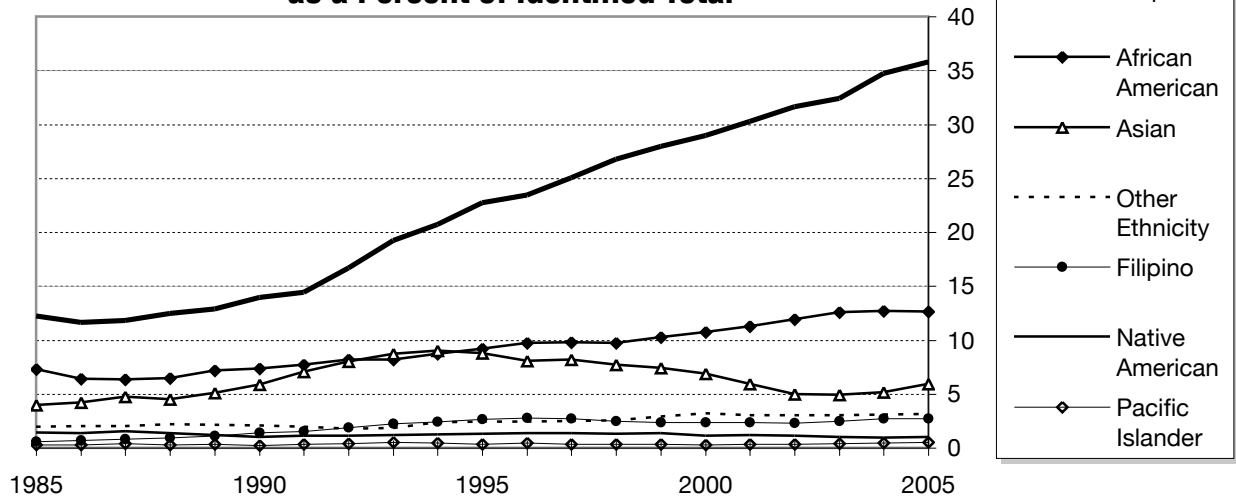
