CSUSB Admissions and Student Recruitment will be having a Transfer Day on Feb. 22, 2014 specifically for students who are transferring from a community college and have 60 transferable units or 90 quarterly units. Why does this matter to you? This means that if you have served and have military credits and you think you are ready for Cal State San Bernardino then you should RSVP. This is the day all questions, just like the ones above can be answered under one roof by a professional admissions counselor and to top it off you get to talk to professionals in your major.

But this is the Question and Answers blog, so why don't I get straight to the answers? If you have talked to someone in the admissions office and they mentioned that they are NOT accepting students, it's true. *However, CSUSB IS accepting all current and former service members for admission each quarter.* The regular admissions process is October 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup> every year.



You can apply using the following steps. Go to <https://secure.csumentor.edu/>; this website is the site that you apply to any of the 23 CSU's campuses in California.

If you are ready to transfer or to start attending CSUSB sooner, follow these simple steps:

1. Obtain copies of your military, high school and previous school's transcripts
2. Call, email, or set up an appointment with Juanita Olivo, the CSUSB Veterans Admissions Counselor. Her direct number is 909-537-5207 and her email is [jolivo@csusb.edu](mailto:jolivo@csusb.edu)
3. If you meet the universities requirements then she will guide you on the next steps you need to take to apply.
4. Once you have applied, been admitted and registered for classes, bring your notice of eligibility letter and your DD-214 form from the VA to the Records & Registration office. You can also email them to Melissa McQuead at [mmcquead@csusb.edu](mailto:mmcquead@csusb.edu) . Please make sure you do not forget this step. This step is so important if you are a transfer student and are interested in priority registration and using your GI Bill.



Do you want to know if you qualify for FAFSA (Financial Aid)? Here is the first step:

1. APPLY at <https://fafsa.ed.gov>;
2. Input the information asked of you;
3. Constantly check your **mycovote** to see if you have any financial holds or any holds in general;
4. Stay in touch with the Financial Aid Office at CSUSB by calling or emailing
