# Who can apply to be a Noyce Teaching or Master Teaching Fellow?

- Teaching Fellows:
  - Mathematics single subject credential candidates
  - Beginning secondary mathematics teachers
- Master Teaching Fellows:
  - o Veteran secondary math teachers with a masters degree or equivalent

## Teaching Fellows and Master Teaching Fellows will:

- Receive up to \$10,000 per year for up to five years of participation in the program while teaching full-time in your current school district.
- Earn a Master of Arts in Teaching Mathematics (MAT) at CSUSB
- Participate in lesson study teams supported by your district.
- Attend local, regional, and national conferences while having attendance and travel supported by the grant!

# **Master Teaching Fellows will also:**

- Have opportunities to serve as mentors and in other district leadership positions.
- Attend mentoring training.
- Learn to facilitate professional development.

# Benefits to the Noyce Fellow:

- Up to \$10,000 per year of participation, for up to five years
- Earn a Master of Arts in Teaching Mathematics (MAT) at CSUSB
- Participate in lesson study teams supported by your district
- Attend Noyce Seminars on mathematics education
- Attend local, regional and national conferences (attendance and travel supported by the grant)

### Obligations of the Noyce Fellow:

- Maintain good standing in the MAT program until earning the MAT degree
- Participate in Noyce surveys and external program evaluation for a period of 7 years
- Participate in in-person and electronic dialogs with other Noyce colleagues
- Participate in quarterly or monthly seminars and meetings as scheduled
- Attend local, regional, and national conferences as appropriate
