## Spotlight on: The Writing Center

The CSUSB Writing Center offers:

**One-to-One Writing Conferences** - In these sessions, writing consultants work collaboratively with students, faculty, and staff on writing projects at every stage of the writing process.

**Online Tutoring** - Online tutoring services seek to accomplish the same goals as our one-to-one writing conferences, but through a digital medium using written feedback.

**Workshops** - These workshops are held in the Writing Center, the Graduate Writing Center, and as in-class sessions. Topics include research, revision, citation styles, and plagiarism and academic integrity.

**Conversation Groups** - These groups meet weekly to provide international and multilingual students a friendly, casual environment where they can practice and build confidence in listening to and speaking in English.

## Ask Michael: Study Tips

Lack of preparation and study strategies can hinder student success. We asked admissions recruiter/counselor and CSUSB alumnus, Michael Harrison on improving student studying habits.

#### Q: How do I prepare for an exam?

A: There are many ways to prepare for an exam. You must first identify the type of study environment that works best for you. Are you a morning person? A night owl? Also, study early and often. Develop a system for studying and stick to it daily. Also, make sure you get plenty of rest so that your body and mind will be recharged for the exam.

#### Q: Is reviewing notes really that important?

A: Yes. Develop a system of note-taking where you can organize the information. Often students take notes and don't look at them again until it's time for an exam. It may be helpful to review your notes the same day as you took them, while the information is fresh. This way you can organize and structure the important information.

#### Q: Are study groups worth it?

A: Study groups can be helpful. Study groups give students the opportunity to discuss difficult material and add new perspective. Study groups can also be counterproductive if members of the group are not focused on helping the rest of the group. Each student will have his/her own preference on the size of the group.

#### Q: Can I talk to my instructor if I have any questions?

A: Instructors provide students with their weekly office hours. Students should make an effort to make regular use of their instructor's office hours to ask any questions they might have or provide clarification. Students must also make sure they have done their part. Make sure you read through your material and take appropriate notes so that when you meet with the instructor, you can bring well-thought out questions and discussion points.
