

# Student Success Initiative (SSI)

What is SSI? <a href="http://ssi.csusb.edu/">http://ssi.csusb.edu/</a>

The Student Success Initiative (SSI) fees were put in place at CSUSB in June 2011 under Executive Order 1060 from the California State University Chancellor's Office. (See expanded history of SSI at CSUSB) The fees, which are assessed in three categories—Student Success, Graduation and Career Placement—are intended to improve advising and retention services, increase student development opportunities, expand access to critical technologies, and enhance career services. Students are consulted for advice on the use of revenues received from this fee, and the campus has developed a plan for accountability to ensure proper management of fee revenues. The president is delegated authority under Executive Order 1054 to increase, decrease, suspend or eliminate this fee as needed.

Revenues from the Student Success Initiative Fee goes towards the following four (4) priorities which comprise the Campus' Student Success, Graduation and Career Placement initiative:

Program	Quarterly Rate
Advising and Retention	\$16
Student Development	\$9
Expanded Technologies	\$13
Career Services	\$16
Total	\$54/quarter

The CSUSB Student Success Initiative partnered with ASI to host an information session on May 28 in the SMSU Lobby. Various units from across participated and shared information regarding the opportunities they provide to students thanks to Student Success Fees.

# Ask Matt Markin Academic Advisor

Is there a right way to e-mail my professor?

In a world of instant communication through text, FaceTime, Skype, etc., we may consider ourselves pros at how to communicate. What about email? Many times I hear, "My instructor did not email me back" or "My professor overlooked my email!" In reality, your professors are inundated with a massive amount of email per day. If you want a better chance of your professor reading and responding to your email, follow these tips:

- 1. Use your Coyote email: You have a better chance of your professor opening an e-mail from your Coyote email or a reputable email address such as <a href="mailto:yourname@gmail.com">yourname@gmail.com</a>. If your professor sees an email is from <a href="mailto:likes2party@gmail.com">likes2party@gmail.com</a>, your email might end up deleted.
- 2. Subject lines matter: Receiving so many emails daily, your professors may skim through their incoming emails. Make your e-mail stand out with a strong subject line. "Class 101-Your Name" or "Class 101 Homework question" stand out more and are more favorable than a subject line that demands attention such as "READ NOW" or "URGENT".
- 3. Use salutations: Address your professor such as "Dear Professor Kafovalu" or "Hello Professor Mendoza". This way you are being professional and your professor knows if you really meant to send them the e-mail.
- 4. Don't bury the lead: Simply put, get to the point as quickly as possible. Your professors don't want or have the time to read a novel. If you have multiple questions, type the questions in a list format. Make sure in your email to include your name and Coyote ID number.
- 5. Review your email: Before hitting the send button, proofread your email. Correct any punctuation and grammatical errors, as well as eliminate emoticons and text type messages.
- 6. Don't use email for all your questions: Sometimes asking a question through email is not always the best option. Questions that can be viewed as complicated should be addressed in person during office hours.
