Xi Jingping has been concentrating power at the top in China in a manner surprisingly reminiscent of Mao Zedong's rule. What will be the consequences for domestic and foreign policy? Is Xi's approach to leadership sustainable or might it lead to a backlash among the political elite, intellectuals, and middle class citizens?

Susan Shirk is the Chair of the 21st Century China Program and Ho Miu Lam Professor of China and Pacific Relations at the School of International Relations and Pacific Studies (IR/PS) at UC San Diego. She also is director emeritus of the University of California, Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation (IGGC). From 1997-2000, Shirk served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State in the Bureau of East Asia and Pacific Affairs, with responsibility for China, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Mongolia. Shirk's publications include her books, China: Fragile Superpower; The Political Logic of Economic Reform in China; How China Opened Its Door: The Political Success of the PRC's Foriegn Trade and Investment Reforms; Competitive Comrades: Career Incentives and Student Strategies in China; and her edited book, Changing Media, Changing China.
