In accordance with the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, California State University San Bernardino is pleased to share with you the following information on the graduation rates of our Fall 2016 cohort of full-time, first-time, degree or certificate seeking undergraduates.

As reported in the IPEDS graduation rates survey (GRS), during the Fall 2016 semester, 2,736 first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students entered California State University San Bernardino. Of these students, 54% had graduated from California State University San Bernardino within 150% of the normal time to complete their degree (as of August 31, 2022).
