SUBJECT: FY 2023-2024 Cost Allocation Plan (Plan)

Executive Order 1000 requires the University to ensure that costs incurred by the CSU Operating Fund for services, products, and facilities provided to Auxiliary Organizations and other CSU funds are properly and consistently recovered with cash and/or a documented exchange of value. Allowable direct costs incurred by the CSU Operating Fund are to be allocated and recovered based on actual costs incurred. Allowable and allocable indirect costs shall be recovered according to a cost allocation plan (CAP) that utilizes a documented and consistent methodology, including the identification of indirect costs and a basis for allocation. The campus Chief Financial Officer, or designee, is required to annually approve and implement the cost allocation plan.

Fiscal Year 2023-24 Cost Allocation methodology was discussed with the Auxiliary and Enterprise Entity officials. The Plan was finalized based on the discussions and the comments received.

The Plan was presented to the Cabinet for discussion and approval.

The summary Cost Allocation Plan schedule (ATTACHMENT A) for FY 23-24 is provided. The Cost Allocation Plan document will be available on the Budget Office website as well.
