ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

CSUSB accepts applications from first-year freshmen and upper-division transfer students from across California and around the world. As an impacted campus, CSUSB is dedicated to serving students from high schools and community colleges from CSUSB's defined local area. To ensure we can accommodate as many eligible students as possible, all applicants must meet CSU requirements to be considered, and additional CSUSB requirements based on the last school an applicant attended or their intended major. Students can apply to CSUSB for programs at the campus in San Bernardino or Palm Desert Campus.

APPLY TO CSUSB

Submit an application online between October 1 and November 30 at: calstate.edu/apply

- 1. Watch for an application acknowledgment email to your personal email to let you know we have received your application, which includes your Coyote ID number and CSUSB email account information.
- 2. Activate your MyCoyote account to view your application status online and determine if there are any other documents you need to turn in.
- 3. Review your CSUSB email, which will be available in your MyCoyote portal, for updates regarding required materials and your admission status. All communications regarding your application will be sent to your CSUSB email.

Email is an official means of communication at CSUSB. Check your CSUSB email frequently and MyCoyote portal. Students are responsible for admissions information provided via their CSUSB email account.

FINANCIAL AID & **SCHOLARSHIPS**

More than 78 percent of our students receive financial aid awards averaging approximately \$10,700 per year. Of those students, 57 percent are funded entirely through grants and never have to pay a single penny for tuition.

KNOW YOUR AID

FEDERAL PELL GRANT

This is a grant provided by the federal government to help pay for educational expenses. Federal Pell Grants are awarded to students who display exceptional financial need and have not earned a bachelor's, graduate, or professional degree. (In some cases however, a student enrolled in a postbaccalaureate teacher credential program might be eligible Federal Pell Grant).

STATE UNIVERSITY GRANT


The State University Grant (SUG) is a CSU systemwide award provides need-based awards to eligible students who are California residents or otherwise determined as eligible, such as AB 540-eligible students.

CAL GRANTS

A Cal Grant is money for college; it does not require repayment. To qualify, you must apply for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA) by the deadline and meet the eligibility and financial requirements as well as any minimum GPA requirements. Your eligibility will be based on your FAFSA or CADAA responses, your verified Cal Grant GPA, the type of California colleges you list on your FAFSA, and whether you're a recent high school graduate. Cal Grant A will pay tuition for a maximum of four years. If you're applying using your high school GPA, you must have at least a 3.0 GPA; if applying using your college GPA, you must have at least a 2.4 GPA. Cal Grant B provides a living allowance of \$1,672 for a maximum of four years, in addition to tuition assistance after the first year. Requires at least a 2.0 GPA.

DIRECT LOANS

Direct Loans are offered through a loan program administered by the federal government. These are financial aid awards that need to be repaid. Direct Subsidized Loans are loans made to eligible undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need to help cover educational costs. Direct Unsubsidized Loans are loans made to eligible undergraduate, graduate, and professional students, but eligibility is not based on financial need. Loan amounts awarded are based on grade level.

HOSPITALITY

With dozens of national and state parks, picturesque beach resorts, world-class music festivals and amusement parks, California is known around the globe as a travel destination. For this reason the demand of trained hospitality professionals: hotel and restaurant managers, event planners, tour operators and marketers, is high. To meet this demand, CSUSB Palm Desert Campus launched a new Hospitality Management Program.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The Entrepreneurship Program at California State University, San Bernardino Palm Desert Campus is the first program of its kind in the entire CSU system and the only 3rd program in the entire state of California. The Entrepreneurship Program at the Palm Desert Campus is designed to offer students a business degree to provide a comprehensive education to launch entrepreneurial and new business ventures at large.

CYBERSECURITY

The Cybersecurity Center (CSC) is a pioneer in cybersecurity education. In 2014, CSUSB received our designation as a CAE in Cyber Defense Education (CDE) through 2021, recognized for our specialty areas in Cyber Investigations and Network Security Administration. The Cybersecurity Program at the Palm Desert Campus provides students with unique learning environments that help accelerate their growth inside and outside of the classroom. From stripping a car to create a vehicleto-vehicle test bench to providing resources for student projects run through CISO, the student experience at CSUSB is like no other in the Nation.

KINESIOLOGY

Exercise Science Our Kinesiology-Exercise Science is one of the most popular programs among the 23 CSU's in the state of California. The Kinesiology-Exercise Science allows students to obtain careers in exercise testing, fitness and wellness, self coaching, among many more.



CAMPUS LIFE

UNIVERSITY LEGACY SCHOLARSHIPS

The University Legacy Scholarships are scholarships awarded to first-time freshmen students who will attend the Palm Desert Campus. The Scholarships honor outstanding students and will provide up to \$7,000 for up to four years of undergraduate study.

MARY STUART ROGERS SCHOLARSHIPS

The Mary Stuart Rogers Scholarships are scholarships awarded to Palm Desert Campus students who have declared a major offered at the Palm Desert Campus. This scholarship awards between ten to twenty \$3,900 scholarships.

LINKING CSUSB'S PALM DESERT AND SAN BERNARDINO CAMPUSES

Our shuttle provides students with a transportation option to programs and services offered on both campuses. Each shuttle is equipped with air conditioning and heating, wi-fi, power outlets, tinted windows and window shades, and more. The shuttle service operates Monday - Friday during academic semesters (except for summer sessions) and follows the campus calendar. The program is open to all CSUSB students, faculty, and staff at no extra cost. All riders will be required to swipe their valid Coyote ID upon boarding.
