School of Social Work BASW Program

The BASW Program is offered at both the San Bernardino and Palm Desert Campus!

What is the goal?

- To educate students starting their social work practice
- To equip students to work in agency settings with individuals, families, groups and communities encountering problems related to person or social circumstances.

Coursework in the BASW program focuses on social work and related fields, along with upper-divisional general education requirements. In the final year of the program students complete a two-day per week field placement in a social service agency.

School of Social Work BASW Program

Social Work courses at the San Bernardino Campus are held Mondays/Wednesdays in the evenings and Social Work courses at the Palm Desert Campus are held on Tuesdays/Thursdays in the daytime. In the final year of the program students will be in placement on the days not scheduled for SW courses.

Students interested in applying to the Social Work program need to submit a complete supplemental application.

Admissions Requirements

- <u>Transfer students need to simultaneously apply to the university via Cal State Apply and complete the supplemental application.</u>
- Complete Prerequisite Courses
 - View prerequisite equivalent list for local community colleges
- Overall GPA of 2.50 or better
- Professional Statement
 - 3-to-4-page statement about your understanding of and "fit" with the social work profession
- References
 - 2 references (forms will be provided in the application packet)

- Your goal is to have all or nearly all your social work prerequisites completed so that it is feasible for you to complete the program within two years.
- If accepted, you will begin the program in the Fall.

For those students who are...

- Interested in working in public child welfare
- Willing to commit to working for a county child welfare agency in California for at least one year upon graduating from the BASW program
- The stipend is \$15,000 (2 installments of \$7,500) granted in your second year of the BASW program.

You must apply separately once admitted to the program.

Note: Program is currently only offered to SB campus SW students.
