

DESIGNATED SUBJECTS CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION CREDENTIAL PROGRAM

Admission to the Program

Preliminary Designated Subjects Credential requirements or Program Coordinator's permission. Teaching experience under a state issued teaching credential or successful completion of ECTS 1000 prior to or during the first quarter.

Credential Requirements

For High School ROP

Appropriate work experience and a high school diploma (or the equivalent) is required for admission to the Designated Subjects Career and Technical (CTE) Teaching Credential Program. Applicants should have at least three years of verifiable work experience directly related to each industry sector to be named on the credential. One year must equal a minimum of 1000 clock hours and the experience may be full-time or part-time, paid or unpaid. Additional information can be obtained from the College of Education Credential Services.

Teaching experience is not generally accepted as work experience; however, for the purpose of meeting the recency requirement any of the following, or a combination of the following, may be cumulated to total 1000 clock hours: Work experience, College-level related course work, Non-college related course work, Occupational internship, or CTE teaching experience.

A "preliminary" designated subject's credential is issued based on documented work experience, and the "clear" credential issued after the applicant has completed the indicated course work, met the health education requirement (listed below) and actually taught under the "preliminary" credential.
