

Cartouche

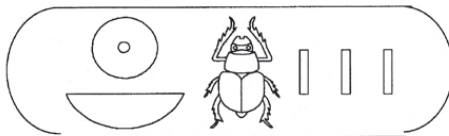
In Egyptian hieroglyphs, a cartouche is an oval shape with a line at one end. The cartouche shape tells the reader that the writing inside is a royal name. The cartouche is meant to protect the person from evil spirits in life and after death.

Egyptians also believed that if you had your name written down you would not disappear after you died.
