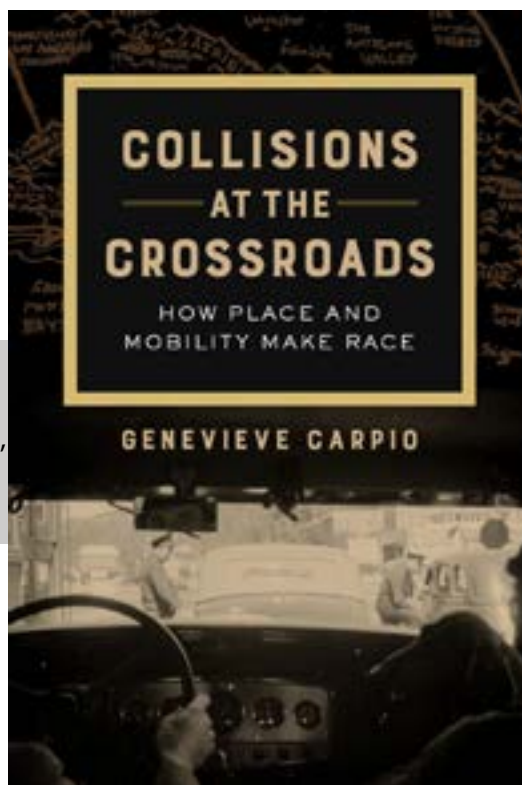


The Pfau Library's Conversations on Race and Policing Presents:
