Self-Directed Study Concentration

In the Self-Directed Study Concentration, an interested student will draft a specific proposal/program plan, including all the classes they intend to take and a rationale for the courses of study. This proposal will be vetted by a committee consisting of the coordinators for the four concentrations. Before becoming eligible to declare this Concentration, students must complete the following core classes: ENG 2000, ENG 2400, ENG 2500, ENG 3110, and either ENG 3010 or 3030.

1. Any 6 upper-division ENG courses, selected according to a plan devised in consultation with the department (18). Note: With prior approval from the department, students may substitute 6 units of coursework from outside of the major. We encourage students to take one of their six courses from the following:

MINOR IN BORDER STUDIES (18 units). Interdisciplinary minor focused on policies, perceptions, and practices related to the U.S./Mexico Border.

MINOR IN CREATIVE WRITING (21 units). Focused minor designed to support the development of students' creative writing processes, through a range of foundation, workshop, and seminar courses.
