Prerequisites for Admission:

- Proof of completion of B.A. or B.S. degree in another field from a regionally accredited college or university with a minimum GPA of 3.00
- Courses:

- Human Anatomy and Human Physiology with a Lab (BIOL 223 & BIOL 223 or BIOL 323 & 324 for Bio Majors)
- o General Biology with a Lab (BIOL 200, 201, and 202)
- Microbiology with a Lab
- General Chemistry (CHEM 215 & CHEM 216)
- Organic Chemistry (CHEM 221, CHEM 222, and CHEM 223)
- o Biochemistry (CHEM 436A)
- o Inorganic Chemistry with a Lab
- o Physics (PHYS 121, 122, and 123)
- English, Communication or Speech**
 - It is required to take an english course on composition or technical writing
- 40 hours minimum of Dental Shadowing Experience.
- Three Letters of Recommendations
 - Two letters from science professors and One of your choice (e.g., dentist, research or work manager/supervisor)
 - OR one committee letter
- Requires the Dental Admissions Test (DAT). The scores are only valid for two years.

- Shadowing a dental experience are very beneficial helping applicants to better understand their own fit within the profession, communicate that understanding with real-world examples, and demonstrate their commitment to the field of dentistry.
 - There is no specific number of hours required for shadowing or dental experience, applicants are encouraged to obtain as much as possible prior to applying.
- Three Letters of Recommendations
 - One letter should be written by a college science professor, one by a dentist with whom you have volunteered, or an adviser, researcher or mentor; and one from an individual of your choice. Or, you may have one composite letter sent from a preprofessional health advisory committee in lieu of the three required letters.
- Requires the Dental Admissions Test (DAT).

Prerequisites for Admission:

- Proof of completion of B.A. or B.S. degree in another field from a regionally accredited college or university with a minimum GPA of 2.7. To be competitive applicant, a 3.5 or higher GPA is recommended
- Courses:

- o General Biology with a Lab (BIOL 200, 201, and 202)
- o General Chemistry with a Lab (CHEM 215 & CHEM 216)
- o Organic Chemistry with a Lab (CHEM 221, CHEM 222, and CHEM 223)
- Biochemistry (CHEM 436A, CHEM 437A)
- o Physics (PHYS 121, 122, and 123)
- English Composition
- Recommended Courses (Listed in order of Priority):
 - Histology
 - Human Gross Anatomy
 - Systems Physiology
 - Microbiology
 - Cellular and Molecular Biology
 - Immunology
 - Neuroscience
 - Genetics
 - Biochemistry II or III
- 50 hours minimum of Dental Shadowing Experience.
- Three Letters of Recommendations
 - The three letters can be any of the following → Spiritual leader, employer or professional, pre–professional committee or science professor
- Requires the Dental Admissions Test (DAT). The scores are only valid for two years. To be competitive, scores of 20 or above in all areas are advised.

- Proof of completion of B.A. or B.S. degree in another field from a regionally accredited college or university with a minimum GPA of 3.00
- Courses:

- o General Biology with a Lab (BIOL 200, 201, and 202)
- o General Chemistry with a Lab (CHEM 215 & CHEM 216)
- o Organic Chemistry with a Lab (CHEM 221, CHEM 222, and CHEM 223)
- o Physics (PHYS 121, 122, and 123)
- English Composition (3 quarters)
- Philosophy, history or fine arts (3 quarters)
- Shadowing a dental experience are very beneficial helping applicants to better understand their own fit within the profession, communicate that understanding with real-world examples, and demonstrate their commitment to the field of dentistry.
 - There is no specific number of hours required for shadowing or dental experience, applicants are encouraged to obtain as much as possible prior to applying.
- Two Letters of Recommendations
 - Two letters of recommendation are required from lecture-based science professors in biology, chemistry, or physics. We highly recommend that one of the letters be from a DDS. Letters from research or lab-based professors will not meet the requirement; the letters must be written based on your performance in the lecture component of class. A committee letter may be substituted if your undergraduate institution offers this service.
- Requires the Dental Admissions Test (DAT). The scores are only valid for two years.

- Three Letters of Recommendations
 - o Dean or head of the applicant's dental school
 - Dental school clinical instructor who is able to evaluate the applicant's potential
 - A person of the applicant's choosing, preferably someone with whom the applicant has worked with
- Requires the Dental Admissions Test (DAT). The scores are only valid for two years.

- Courses:

- o General Biology with a Lab (BIOL 200, 201, and 202)
- o General Chemistry (CHEM 215 & CHEM 216)
- Organic Chemistry (CHEM 221, CHEM 222, and CHEM 223)
- o Physics (PHYS 121, 122, and 123)
- English Composition
- o Recommended Courses:
 - Biochemistry, Genetics, Cell Biology, Human Anatomy & Physiology, Microbiology, Calculus 1, Biometrics, Psychology, and Conversational Spanish
- 30 hours minimum of Dental Shadowing Experience.
- Three Letters of Recommendations
 - Two letters from science professors and One of your choice (e.g., dentist, research or work manager/supervisor)
 - o OR one committee letter
