Dolores Canales is the Director of Community Outreach with The Bail Project, a National organization designed to combat mass incarceration by disrupting the money bail system — one person at a time.

She has extensive experience in management, community organizing, and is co-founder of California Families Against Solitary Confinement. Having a father who was in prison, Dolores is personally familiar with the intergenerational impacts of incarceration.

She brings a wealth of leadership experience in organizing with those personally affected by incarceration, drawing from her own experiences as well as having a son who is incarcerated and participated in 3 of California State Prison hunger strikes to end the use of indefinite solitary confinement.

Dolores is a 2014 Soros Justice Fellow, 2019 Initiate Justice Fellow and 2020 WoJo Fellow. Dolores was recently appointed a voting member by LA Supervisor Janice Hahn on the Alternatives to Incarceration work group and is currently organizing Community Engagement workshops across Los Angeles in neighborhoods with a high impact of incarceration.
