

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Equality California Mentorship Corps is an AmeriCorps service program with options for service in Fresno, Palms Springs, and Oceanside, California.

Full-time members commit to 11 months of service and 1700 total service hours, working in middle and high schools, providing mentorship and support to LGBTQ+ and all students. Corps members are compensated with a modest living allowance of \$21,000 per service year, and, upon successful completion of the program, are eligible for a \$10,000 education award.

REQUIREMENTS

- Be at least 18 years or older (by July 1, 2022).
- · Possess at least a Bachelor's degree (BA)
- Be a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident. Unfortunately, applicants who have received Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) through the U.S. Department of Homeland Security are not eligible to serve as AmeriCorps members at this time.
- · Able to commit to completing 1700 hours of full-time service over 11 months (July 2022 May 2023).
- · Has served no more than three terms in an AmeriCorps state or national program.
- Because the safety of students is our priority, every confirmed AmeriCorps member must undergo a criminal history check. In cases where a criminal offense appears, the circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.
