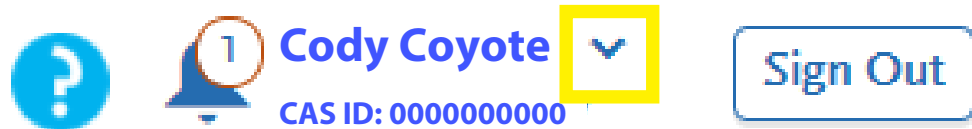


Extended Profile - Transfer Student

CSUSB is an impacted campus and only accepts applicants at specific times in their academic progress. In Cal State APPLY, the extended profile is where you report your academic status. Incorrect answers in this section can block you from applying to available programs, majors, or even CSUSB completely.

To make sure you are reporting your academic progress correctly, we have created these samples.

- 1** First time applicants will be asked to answer the Extended Profile questions before progressing to the full application. Returning applicants, who have previously set up a Cal State APPLY account, will need to navigate to their extended profile. It can be found in the upper right corner of the screen by clicking on the down arrow next to your full name.



- 2** As Undergraduates, CSUSB only accepts First Bachelor's Degree applicants. Please choose the option displayed.

1. Degree Goal

* What degree, credential or certificate are you applying for?

- First Bachelor's Degree (Seeking your first bachelor's degree and have not earned a prior bachelor's degree)
- Second Bachelor's Degree and Beyond (e.g. Master's, Teaching Credential, Certificate, Doctoral)

The following is a list of acceptable applicant types for CSUSB. Examples of the Transfer applicant choices are in bold:

High School graduate with no College Credit (First-Year Student)

High School graduate with College Credit obtained before High School Graduation (First-Year Student)

Associates Degree for Transfer (ADT) student

Transferring from a Community College or 4 year institution (Upper Division Transfer Student)

Transfer Student (60+ units)

Transfer Student (0-59 units)

CSUSB only accepts applications for transfer students that have achieved Upper-Division status by completing 60 or more semester (90 quarter) units baccalaureate-level courses from regionally accredited institutions.

Choosing the option of 0-59 semester credits will result in **NO** programs or majors being available to you.

Please make sure that you have or are on track to have completed the required amount of units to be eligible for admission to CSUSB.

ADT Transfer Student

An Associates Degree for Transfer (ADT) is a very specific type of degree that is different than an Associates of Arts (AA) or Associates of Sciences (AS) degree. Earning an ADT from a California Community College allows students to satisfy most, if not all, lower-division general education requirements and major requirements for transfer to California State University, San Bernardino.

If you are unsure if you will be receiving an ADT or a regular AA/AS degree, you should check with your Community College.

An ADT degree is not a requirement for admission, but students with an ADT from a CSUSB local area community college are given priority in the application review process.
