

Fall 2020 Enrollment Survey Undergraduate New Transfers and Continuing Students

Between July 30, 2020 and August 17, 2020, the Office of Institutional Research and Analytics surveyed undergraduate new transfers and continuing students to better understand unit load for Fall 2020. The survey was administered to students enrolled in less than 15 units as of July 30, 2020 (n= 8,235). A total of 1,056 (13%) students participated in the survey. Participants were asked their unit load for the upcoming semester (less than 12 units, 12 to 14 units, 15 or more units). The survey was sent out 53 days away from Census, making it possible for students to add more classes prior to completing the survey. A total of 829 (79%) of participants responded they are enrolled in less than 15 units. The top reasons reported for not enrolling in 15 or more units were not wanting to take too many online courses, the course(s) wanted were full, and could not find the course(s) needed.

The classes suggested to me were given by my advisor.

The classes that I need left, which are five, are in the spring semester

The course I had requested was cancelled due to lack of student interest. Otherwise, I would have been at 15 credits. Also, I only have the Fall semester and Spring (which will be only 12 credits) before I graduate.

The course load I feel will not be suitable to add another class. It's going to take teachers who are not used to semesters to better their curriculum around it and I do not think 3 months (especially with a GLOBAL PANDEMIC) is good enough time. Even though it's been talked about for a while, I feel teachers are just like us students and will need time to adapt.

The courses I have chosen are going to be a lot to handle, for example I will be taking chem and biology which comes with labs and discussion courses plus one GE. I was recommended by my advisor to keep my schedule as it since those courses can be a little difficult.

The three lectures I'm taking include labs. So I do not want to enroll in more classes than what I can handle.

The two classes I am enrolled in are offered this Fall. The rest of the classes that I need are not offered until the Spring.

There is no need for me to graduate in two years. I will be taking nine units this semester and in the Spring. If I need to take a class in the Summer I will. This will position me to graduate in the Fall of 2021.
