FACULTY DEVELOPMENT CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

(Application deadline 10/01/22; award \$1,500)

Faculty participants attend any 12 one-hour sessions from a list of approved presentations posted on the Faculty Development website; topics include teaching & learning; research; diversity, equity, & inclusion; new faculty mentoring; and community service. Other program requirements include an informal 750-word essay about what you learned from the presentations affected your teaching, research, and/or community service practices; completion of the Certificate Program survey; and participation in the Spring 2023 Certificate ceremony.

TEACHING & INSTRUCTION

FALL CANVAS INSTITUTE

(Application deadline 8/31/22; award \$1,000)

Faculty participants attend a two-hour face-to-face or online synchronous Canvas Boot Camp, then with support by facilitators work through a moderated, self-guided, approximately 20-hour Canvas course over six weeks which introduces features and best practices in using the Canvas learning management system.

QUALITY ONLINE TEACHING PROGRAM

[Application deadline 9/16/22; award \$1,500 (with QLT course) or \$500 (course development only)]

Faculty participants take a 21-day, 20-hour introductory or intermediate online course in best practices in asynchronous online teaching and then, working with an instructional designer, develop their own asynchronous online course for the 2023-2024 academic year.

NEXT GENERATION SMART CLASSROOM COSYNCHRONOUS TEACHING PROGRAM

(Application deadline 9/16/22; award \$1,500)

Faculty participants take one-hour on-site training in best pedagogical practices in our Next Generation Smart Classrooms as well as two self-guided Canvas courses, "Essentials of Teaching in Canvas" (about six hours) and "Best Practices in Cosynchronous Teaching" (about two hours).

INNOVATIVE COURSE DEVELOPMENT GRANTS

(Application deadline TBA Spring 2023; award \$6,100)

The purpose of the TRC Course Development grants is to support faculty to redesign or develop a course in ways that implement high-impact, evidence-based, and/or innovative teaching strategies to improve student learning. Such redesign and/or development must go significantly above and beyond regular course preparation and clearly relate to improving student learning and engagement. Support from this grant program does not include support for course revision or course development that is part of faculty's regular teaching assignment.

TEACHING SKILLS STUDY AWARDS (TSSA)

(Application deadline TBA for Fall 2022 & Spring 2023; award \$400-1,000)

The purpose of the TSSA program is to enhance faculty's teaching by attending a conference devoted to university teaching or to a high-impact, evidence or a newly developing teaching practice.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

ESTABLISHING COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

(Application deadline 9/16/22, 10/7/22, 11/18/22, 12/2/22; award up to \$3,000)

This grant program offers faculty substantial support in their efforts to establish or further develop community partnerships as a first step to other community engagement strategies, including but not limited to community-based learning and service learning both in formal classes and in other teaching related activities, as well as in community-based and community participatory research, scholarly, and creative activities

COMMUNITY-BASED RESEARCH MINI-GRANTS

(Application deadline 9/16/22, 10/7/22, 11/18/22, 12/2/22; award up to \$5,000)

This program offers faculty a mini-grant to support community-based research (CBR) projects. CBR is a partnership between University researchers and community partners who collaboratively engage in research with the purpose of solving a pressing community-identified issue and/or effect social change.

SERVICE LEARNING FELLOWSHIP

(Application deadline 9/16/22, 10/7/22, 11/18/22, 12/2/22; award up to \$2,000)

The Fellowship program is designed to support faculty in developing service learning opportunities for CSUSB students. Service Learning Fellows can use these funds to infuse service learning into an existing course or to develop a new course with a strong service learning component.

GLOBAL LEARNING

PROFESSORS ACROSS BORDERS

(Application deadline 2/1/23; award up to \$2,500)

The PAB program contributes to campus internationalization by facilitating faculty engagement in international research, conference presentations and publications, grant writing, and curriculum internationalization.

OFFICE OF STUDENT RESEARCH

FACULTY/STUDENT GRANTS

(Application deadline 9/25/22; award \$1,500)

The Faculty/Student Grants offered by the Office of Student Research (OSR) are designed to facilitate the initiation and development of collaborative research or creative activity (RCA) between students and faculty. The maximum amount of \$1,500 may be awarded to each faculty/student team. The number of grants awarded depends on budgets and the funds available to the Office of Student Research each year. Projects under this program are intended to provide students in-depth "hands-on" experience in the research or creative activity process.

RESEARCH AND CREATIVE ACTIVITIES FACULTY MENTOR AWARD

(Application deadline 2/26/23; award \$2,000)

In recognition of our faculty, the OSR has created the Faculty Research and Creative Activities (RCA) Mentor Award. Contingent on the availability of funding, the award will annually recognize the contributions, within the previous two years of up to five faculty (one per college), whose mentoring is considered exemplary. Each Faculty RCA Mentor Award recipient will receive \$2,000. The application review committee will evaluate faculty's contributions to student success and evidence of their mentorship to students in research and creative activities within the previous two academic years.

UNDERGRADUATE SUMMER RESEARCH PROGRAM

(Application deadline: 2/26/23; award \$5,000)

The Undergraduate Summer Research Program provides funding and resources to support undergraduate students who are interested in pursuing research projects or scholarly activities related to their field over the summer term. Faculty apply for this program with a team of two to three students. The role of the faculty in the summer program is crucial.
