Dr. Isabel Baca is an Associate Professor in the English Department and Director of the Bilingual Professional Certificate Writing Program at the University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP). She is a community-engaged scholar and a native of El Paso, which has shaped her research interests in community writing, service-learning, and multiliteracies. Dr. Baca's edited collection, Service-Learning and Writing: Paving the Way for Literacy(ies) through Community Engagement, explores how writing instruction and practice can complement community engagement and outreach in local, national, and international contexts. Her book Bordered Writers: Latinx Identities and Literacy Practices at Hispanic-Serving Institutions, co-authored with Yndalecio I. Hinojosa, and Susan Wolff-Murphy, explores the complex intersection between Latinx students' identities and their literacy practices at Hispanic-Serving Institutions. Drawing on case studies and personal narratives, the book sheds light on the experiences of Latinx students and provides insights into how they navigate and negotiate the borders between languages, cultures, and academic expectations. Dr. Baca also founded and directs the Community Writing Partners program at UTEP, which provides students with internship and service-learning opportunities with over twenty non-profit organizations. Dr. Baca has published in various journals, including Reflections, Composition Studies, and Latinx Writing and Rhetoric Studies, and has contributed to teaching and understanding writing principles with the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE).
