# Examples of evidence-based programs:

ACCESS, PARTNERSHIPS AND SUPPORT SERVICES

<u>Access</u>: Increase the number of students that are college ready and enroll in institutions of post-secondary education.

### **College Success Program**

Barrio Logan College Institute (CA)

This program gives students comprehensive college-prep services such as tutoring, career exploration, and college application guidance to ensure they are ready to attend institutions of higher education.

### **Hispanic Mother Daughter Program**

Arizona State University (AZ)

An early-outreach middle and high school program designed to increase the number of first-generation Arizona students who are qualified and prepared to enroll at Arizona State University through direct family involvement.

<u>Partnerships</u>: Institutions, community-based organizations, and other stakeholders enter an agreement to ensure student success

### Santa Ana ¡Adelante!

Santa Ana Community College (CA)

Provides every Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) high school graduate with the promise of admission to either California State University, Fullerton (CSUF) or the University of California, Irvine (UCI) as long as they enroll at Santa Ana College (SAC) within one year of graduating from SAUSD and complete all academic and application requirements for transfer.

### **Dream Catchers**

Catch the Next INC. (TX)

Partners with local community colleges and focuses on improving the rate in which students access credit granting coursework.

<u>Support Services</u>: Practices such as counseling, tutoring, and advising, that are offered to students throughout their academic career.

### **Graduate Support Center**

University of the Incarnate Word (TX) The center provides resources, orientation programs, academic and professional workshops, and writing and statistical support.

### Alamo Advise

Alamo Colleges District (TX)

All five colleges in this district provide an intrusive, intentional case management model to facilitate and support student transition from outreach to credential completion.



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# Examples of evidence-based programs:

TRANSFER, RETENTION AND COMPLETION

<u>**Transfer:**</u> Help students successfully transition from 2-year community college programs into 4-year bachelor granting institutions.

### Pathway to the Baccalaureate

Northern Virginia Community College (VA) A partnership between local public school districts, Northern Virginia Community College, and George Mason University to create a designed pathway from high school through college completion.

### **Transfer Academy**

Los Medanos College (CA)

Designed to support students entering below college level course work interested in transferring to a 4-year institution by providing integrated courses, mentoring, study groups, academic advising, university tours, and workshops on the transfer process.

<u>Retention</u>: Ensure students remain at an institution and continue to work towards college completion

## CUMBRES

University of Northern Colorado (CO)

Uses a cohort model for future English as a Second Language (ESL) teachers. Students live together, take classes as a group, receive advising and job placement guidance, and scholarships.

## Students Transitioning to Engaged and Motivated (STEM) Success

California State University – Stanislaus (CA)

Provides monthly student meetings, mentoring and undergraduate research with STEM faculty, conference presentation opportunities, peer mentoring, a summer experience and a first-year general education course specifically for STEM majors.

<u>Completion:</u> Helping students successfully complete a program of study with the appropriate credentials to obtain a degree or enter a graduate program.

## **Bachelor of Social Work Program**

Saint Augustine College (IL)

In response to a growing need of bilingual social workers, this program provides a fully bilingual curriculum to increase the number of Latino social workers in Chicago.

## Bachelor of Applied Science in Organizational Leadership

South Texas College (TX)

This low cost competency based program awards college credit towards their degree for courses already taken and skills developed through a student's work and life experiences.
