### **Tips and Tricks!**

- Consider having **short videos** of you (not just audio) for your students.
  - Helps build a sense of belonging, community, increases interaction, and students invest more in learning when they feel a sense of community!
- Avoid adding a date to your videos.
  - This will help you repurpose them for another semester/course.
- Limit the video software you use to no more than 3 types.
  - Helps avoid burn out, fatigue, and being overwhelmed for students and instructors.

### Free!

 First go for free tools or those with institutional licenses!

### • The big 3s

Approach video lectures in 3 parts:

- Attention grabbers
  - Ice breakers, Q&A, share a fun story, etc.
  - Use the chat box to quickly share a pic/video/meme relevant to the topic to grab attention.

## Content

Focus on content of the lecture and topics. Attention keeper

Apply to real world or something relevant to student life to keep topic.
