MINOR IN BORDER STUDIES (18 units). Interdisciplinary minor focused on policies, perceptions, and practices related to the U.S./Mexico Border.

MINOR IN CREATIVE WRITING (21 units). Focused minor designed to support the development of students' creative writing processes, through a range of foundation, workshop, and seminar courses.

MINOR IN ENGLISH (18 units). Flexible minor for those interested in any of the sub-disciplines in English Studies. Ideal for multiple career paths.

MINOR IN ENGLISH TEACHER PREPARATION (24 units). Recommended for students planning to obtain a single subject teaching credential in language arts (for teaching English at the high school level).
