Overloads: In order to be considered to carry more than the maximum units allowed, a student must be eligible by having both a grade-point average for the previous term of 3.0 or better and an overall grade-point average of 3.0 or better. https://www.csusb.edu/registrar/registration/course-overload

<u>Simultaneous Enrollment</u>: If a student is registering for classes at CSUSB whose meeting times overlap, a petition for simultaneous enrollment must be completed.
