


Liberal Studies (116-145)

General/Structural Differences

 GE and Liberal Studies units are separate in the new curriculum: 49 (GE) + 78-96 (Liberal Studies) + 3 (American Institutions). A few overlaps between GE courses and the core of the major.

- 2970 is now 3 units
- 3970 Gateway to Liberal Studies is a new class. Here is a brief description of the course:

Interdisciplinarity in a diverse K-8 classroom. Disciplinary and theoretical preparation for learning and teaching in California's elementary schools. Overview of the required multiple subjects and interdisciplinary knowledge. Discussion of theories and their corresponding pedagogies in light of a student body with different learning abilities and from a multiplicity of ethnic, linguistic, and cultural backgrounds.

3. The old curriculum involved 29 specialties under the General concentration. The new curriculum involves 12 units of electives for students to design their own course of study, in consultation with their advisors.

Note that

- the 12 elective units need to be selected from the Colleges of Arts and Letters, Natural Sciences, and Social and Behavioral Sciences, and
- at least 3 units must be upper division
