**Subject:** CSUSB COVID-19 Daily Health Screening Requirement

Beginning Wednesday, August 19, in compliance with COVID-19 guidance for higher education from the [California Department of Public Health](#), all CSUSB students, faculty, and staff will be required to complete the **COVID-19 Daily Health Screen** assessment before entering either the San Bernardino or Palm Desert campus, or any CSUSB off-campus center. It is strongly recommended that the **COVID-19 Daily Health Screen** be completed at home before leaving to come to campus. There is no requirement to complete the daily screening if you are not physically coming to either campus or an off-campus center.

The COVID-19 Daily Health Screen can be found in the following locations:

1. Download the [myCoyote app](#) to your smartphone, available for free through [Google Play](#) or the [Apple Store](#).
2. Login to the [myCoyote portal](#), which can be found at <https://my.csusb.edu> or at the top of the [www.csusb.edu](http://www.csusb.edu) website.
3. The [csusb.edu/covid-19](http://csusb.edu/covid-19) website.

The assessment should take 5 minutes or less to complete. Once completed, you will either receive permission to physically enter CSUSB for a 24-hour period or receive instructions on what to do next if not granted permission. This confirmation will appear on the screen and also will be emailed to the address you provided.

All community members are required to display on request their **COVID-19 Daily Health Screen** completion and permission to be on the campus. This request may come from supervisors, faculty members, or other campus safety officials.

The **COVID-19 Daily Health Screen** is a critical component of the campus safety strategy to prevent the spread of COVID-19. In addition, [face coverings](#), social distancing of at least six feet where possible, and frequent hand washing are required at all times when on campus.

There are no exemptions from CSUSB's health and safety requirements for personal beliefs or preferences. Those community members found not strictly following the requirements will be asked to comply immediately. Those who continue to not comply will be removed from university property and will not be granted permission to return until they are prepared to comply. In addition, the matter will be forwarded to appropriate office (Dean of Students, Human Resources, and/or Faculty Affairs) for potential disciplinary action.

Due to the fluid nature of the COVID-19 pandemic, CSUSB health and safety requirements are subject to change. It is important for the campus community to stay connected to the latest campus information through the [csusb.edu/covid-19](http://csusb.edu/covid-19) website.
