Dear CSUSB Student,

In a recent student survey, 33% of students shared with us that they needed a place to study and/or attend virtual courses. In response to this demand, CSUSB has created several limited availability spaces that can be reserved and used by students for on-campus study. Locations will be available starting on Monday, October 12 and have access to campus Wi-Fi.

San Bernardino Campus (available 7am to 9pm, Monday-Friday)

- Yasuda Center. 46 indoor individual workstations are available for student use. Advance reservation required to use these spaces for up to 4 hours per day. <u>Student Study Space Request</u>
- **Center for Global Innovation**. Individual outdoor socially distanced seating is available on the front patio of the building. No reservations are required and are available on a first-come-first-served basis.
- University Hall/SMSU Courtyard. Individual outdoor socially distanced seating is available on the patio between these two buildings. No reservations are required and are available on a first-come-first-served basis.

Palm Desert Campus (available 7am to 8pm, Monday-Friday)

 Health Sciences. Lobby indoor individual workstations are available for student use. Advance reservation required to use these stations for up to 4 hours per day. <u>Student Study Space</u> <u>Request</u>

On-Campus COVID-19 Safety Requirements

To utilize these on-campus study spaces, students must closely adhere to all campus COVID-19 safety requirements.

- Before you come on campus for the first time, students are required to complete the 30minute <u>Returning to Campus during COVID</u> training.
- Each day you come to campus, students must complete the <u>Health Screening Survey</u>. <u>After</u> <u>successful completing the survey</u>, <u>students receive permission to be on the campus for a 24-hour period</u>.
- <u>All study areas are for one student only.</u> <u>Students may not work with other students in the</u> <u>same individual workstation</u>. <u>Social distancing of at least six feet is required at all times</u>.</u>

- Face coverings are required at all times.
- Indoor study spaces will be disinfected after each student use.

In addition to these study spaces, Wi-Fi access remains available in campus parking lots, which students can access from their car. At San Bernardino, parking lot Wi-Fi is available in East and West Parking Structures, plus parking lot N. At Palm Desert, parking lot Wi-Fi is available in the parking lot immediately adjacent to the Indian Wells Theatre.
