Subject: COVID-19 Vaccine Appointments Available Now

Faculty and staff are strongly encouraged to make an appointment to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. The Departments of Public Health in San Bernardino, Riverside, Los Angeles, and Orange Counties have all now prioritized education employees. Interested employees must either live in or work in the county they are looking to receive an immunization.

To take advantage of this priority window for education professionals while appointments are available, you must act quickly. Starting March 15, Governor Newsom has announced that he will adding millions of additional Californians to be prioritized to receive the vaccine with certain health conditions and disabilities, so appointments will again likely be difficult to obtain.

When able to secure an appointment, CSUSB faculty and staff should be prepared to provide a driver's license or personal identification, a CSUSB faculty/staff identification card, and a recent pay stub, at the immunization appointment.

Students, including student assistants, are not currently prioritized for vaccination by the State of California, with the exception of nursing and social work students working in clinical settings, as well as student teachers who are currently engaged with in-person classroom instruction.

With the education tier now prioritized to receive the vaccine, CSUSB will continue pursuing potential opportunities to secure vaccination appointments with providers for our faculty and staff. Additional information will be released if and when these agreements are secured. Please do not contact campus offices for appointment information or vaccination access codes, as they are not currently available.
