CSUSB MERIT-BASED PRESIDENTIAL NONRESIDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must meet all of the following requirements depending on their level (UG/Grad):

- I. New Students: Applicants to CSUSB
 1. In Undergraduate Programs:
 - a. Meet CSUSB undergraduate admission requirements;
 - b. Be a nonresident in the state of California for fee assessment;
 - c. Be enrolled as a matriculated undergraduate student in a course of study of no fewer than fifteen (15) units; and
 - d. Have the following grade point average (GPA) with A=4.0 (scale):
 - i. Freshmen: 3.5 High School GPA;
 - ii. Lower-Division Transfer: 3.5 HS GPA and 3.5 cumulative GPA in all transferable credits attempted; or
 - iii. Upper-Division Transfer: 3.5 cumulative GPA in all transferable credits attempted.
 2. In Graduate Programs:
 - a. Meet CSUSB graduate program admission requirements;
 - b. Be a nonresident in the state of California for fee assessment;
 - c. Be enrolled as a matriculated graduate student in a course of study of no fewer than nine (9) semester units (full time enrollment units may vary by graduate program); and
 - d. Have a grade point average (GPA) of 3.5 (A=4.0) in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) units attempted.
- II. New Students who completed their first term at CSUSB
Undergraduate and graduate students may apply for the Scholarship after their first term of study at CSUSB if they meet the criteria (b) through (d) above in their category (undergraduate or graduate) and have earned a GPA of 3.5 in their first term of study at CSUSB.
- III. Renewal for Continuing students
Undergraduate and graduate students must apply for renewal of the Scholarship each subsequent term of study at CSUSB if they meet the criteria (b) and (c) above in their category (undergraduate or graduate) and maintain a GPA of 3.5 each term of study at CSUSB.

This scholarship program shall apply only during the regular academic year for students in state-supported programs and is not applicable in the summer or winter intersessions or other self-supported programs.

Requirements

Recipients are required to:

1. Maintain 3.5 GPA. Should GPA fall below 3.5, the Scholarship will be permanently terminated;
2. Be enrolled in 15 units for undergraduate students or 9 units for graduate students;
3. Live on campus for the first full academic year. Exceptions shall be reviewed by the Executive Director for Housing and Residential Education and Associate Vice Provost for International Education and shall have their approvals.

Deadlines

For New Students: The Scholarship will be awarded in the fall or spring term of the upcoming academic year with the application deadline of **June 15th for fall 2020 and November 23rd for spring 2021**.

For Continuing Students: The Scholarship will be awarded in the fall or spring term with a deadline of **December 23 for spring 2020 and June 3 for fall 2021** or whenever grades are available for applicable terms.

Award Amount and Period

The amounts of the Presidential Nonresident Scholarship are as follows:

- For undergraduate students: up to \$6,000 per academic year, not to exceed non-resident tuition fees due.
- For graduate students: up to \$4,000 per academic year, not to exceed non-resident tuition fees due.

Maximum Duration of the Award

The Presidential Nonresident Scholarship will be awarded for the following period of time, provided the awardee maintains the minimum GPA of 3.5 and is enrolled in the required number of units :

- four (4) years for first time freshman;
- three (3) years for lower-division transfer students; and
- two (2) years for upper-division transfer and graduate students.
