Program At A Glance:

How does the Noyce Program benefit me?

- Receive up to \$10,000 per year (\$5,000 per semester) in scholarship support.
- Opportunities to observe and work with outstanding math and science teachers in SBCUSD.
- Mentoring and support from secondary math and science teachers, SBCUSD district personnel,
 CSUSB math, science, and College of Education faculty.
- Become a part of a professional learning community centered around current topics in math and science education; a community that will continue to support you even after you become a teacher.

What are my obligations as a Noyce Scholar?

- Observe, tutor, and eventually teach under supervision in a secondary classroom in SBCUSD; Scholars are required to be in the classroom for the first 2 weeks of the SBCUSD school year, which begins in early August and then a minimum of **6 hours per week** for the rest of the year.
- The CSUSB Noyce community comes together one Wednesday per month from 3:30 5:30 pm for a **Noyce seminar**. Noyce Scholars must be able to attend each of these seminars.
- The Noyce scholarship funds come in the form of a forgivable loan. The loan will be completely forgiven once you teach as a full-time employed teacher in a secondary classroom in SBCUSD, two years for every year you receive the scholarship.

Who is eligible for the Noyce Scholars Program?

- Enrolled full-time as a student at CSUSB.
- In junior or senior standing with a major in mathematics, biology, physics, chemistry, or geology.
 or -
- Enrolled in the CSUSB credential program.
- Scholarship recipients must be U.S. citizens or nationals, or permanent residents.
- Have a minimum 3.0 overall GPA and 3.0 GPA in major. If your GPA is slightly lower, you may still be considered depending on the pool of applicants, so please still apply.
