Graduation Checks

EVERY student must file what we call a Grad Check to the Registrar identifying the term that they intend to graduate. Undergraduate students must request a Grad Check when they have completed 135 units towards their degree. Graduate students must request a Grad Check at least one term prior to their expected graduation. <u>REVIEW THIS PAGE</u> and mark it on your calendar.

Commencement Registration

Registering for commencement is different from the Grad Check. This is what gets you on the program and gets you tickets for the ceremony. This year the Jack Brown College of Business and Public Administration will have their commencement at 1:30 pm Saturday June 13. <u>Commencement Registration</u> opens March 16.
