The Minor in Entrepreneurship is designed provide added knowledge, skills, and market value for non-business students (e.g. art, psychology, communication, criminal justice, etc.). By learning concepts such as opportunity recognition, new venture strategy, creative problem solving, and entrepreneurial leadership, students will possess the added capability to launch a new business or contribute to new business development in existing organizations.

The Minor in Entrepreneurship requires all six (6) courses in total. Four (4) courses are required:

- ENTR 442 Small Business Management
- ENTR 543 New Venture Opportunity Analysis
- ENTR 544 New Venture Development
- ENTR 545 New Venture Resource Requirements

Two (2) electives are required, along with a reflective essay taken in your last quarter at PDC (ENTR 598). The electives available at PDC include ENTR 100, MGMT 515, HRM 455 and ADMN 575 (any quarter for 575).
