#### Anti-racist Educator

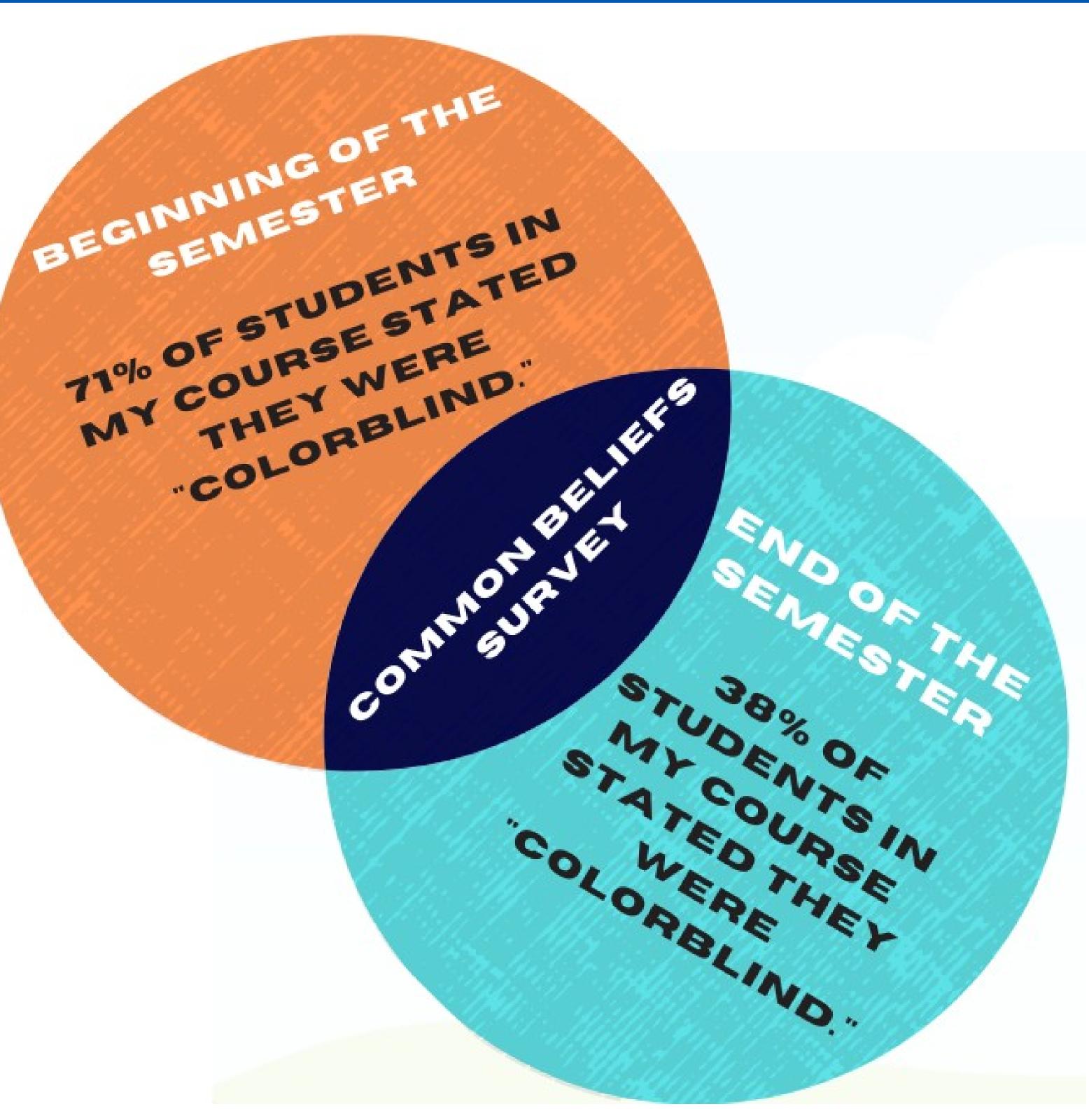
Using the work of Dena Simmons

Escalante, Ervin-Kassab,
and Soodjinda (2020) have
operationalized an anti-racist teacher as
someone who actively works to confront
White supremacy while dismantling the
structures, policies, institutions, and
systems which create barriers and
perpetuate race based intersectional
inequities for BIPOC, through the
enactment of daily pedagogical practices,
classroom management strategies and
critical self-reflection.

#### Four Pandemics

Covid – Systemic Racism – Economic Anxiety – Climate Change

#### Framework

- Intent was Critical Race Theory framework
- Landed more along social justice with efforts toward anti-racism
- Introduction of lesson planning began with social justice standards
- Classroom management focused on SEL, teacher / student rapport, student assets
- I introduced language associated with becoming antiracist:
- white supremacy, biases, racism, intersectionality, identity, abolitionist, critical reflection, joy, equity, assets, freedom, humanizing pedagogies,...
