



## **Probation and Dismissal**

Students who fail to meet the requirements of their program, including maintaining the minimum grade point average, may be placed on probation. Most graduate programs require a minimum 3.0 GPA. Basic teaching credentials, single or multiple subject, will not accept grades lower than a B- in all work attempted with the exception of the designated subjects credential, which requires a 2.5 grade point average in all work. Check with your program coordinator for their course and GPA requirements.

Students on probation must rectify their grade-point deficiencies by the end of the quarter of notification of probationary status. Students who do not raise their GPA are subject to disqualification.

Disqualified students who are registered to attend classes in the current term and any subsequent terms will be dropped from their courses administratively and refunded their registration fees. Students who are receiving financial aid should notify the Financial Aid Office at (909) 537-5227.
