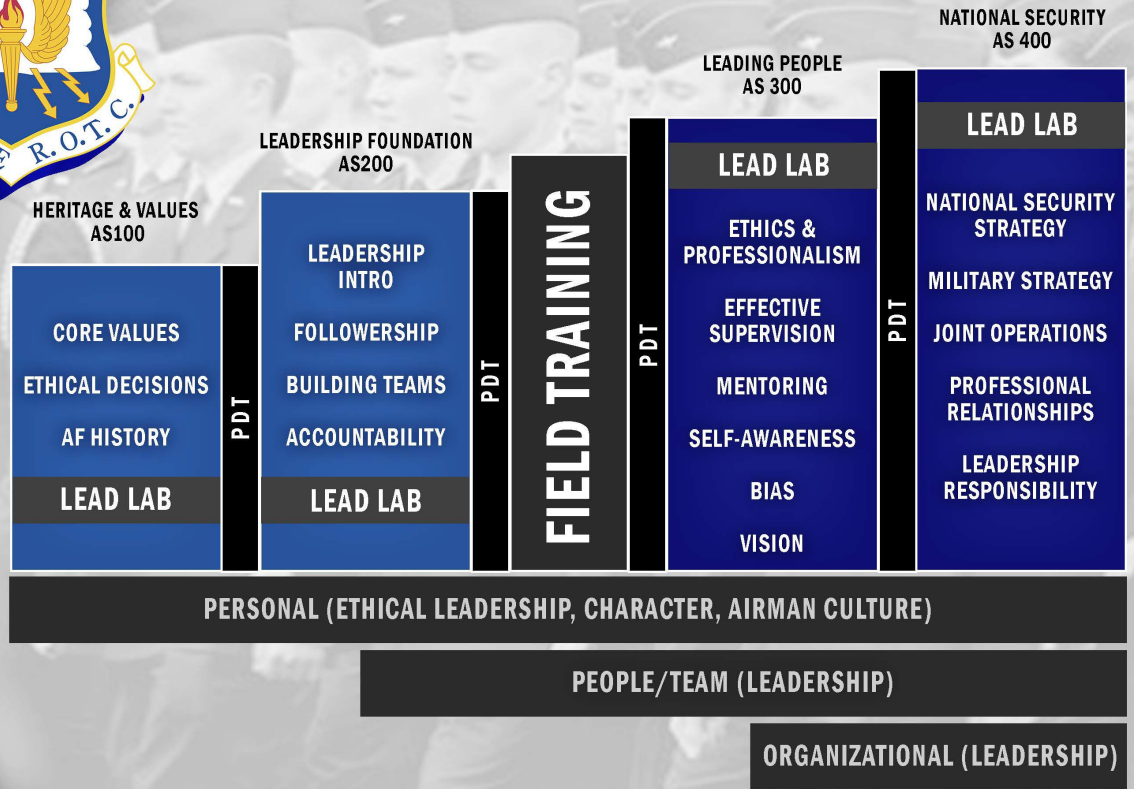

## Leadership Laboratory (LLAB)

- Every Friday at 1:00 – 3:00 PM
- Minimum 80% attendance per quarter

## Physical Training (PT)

- Minimum 80% attendance per quarter

## Pass AFOQT NLT 31 Dec of AS200 year

- Aptitude test similar to SAT or ACT
- Measures Aptitude in 5 Areas:
  - Verbal Minimum: **15th** Percentile
  - Quant Minimum: **10th** Percentile
  - Pilot (25)
  - Navigator (25)
  - Academic aptitude
- Authorized to take the test three times
- **“Super”** score (All Categories)
- ~90 day wait between each attempt

# In-College Scholarship Program (ICSP)

- Type 1 – Uncapped
  - Pays full tuition, fees, \$900 for textbooks
  - Can be used at any AFROTC school
- Type 2 – Up to \$18K/yr for tuition/fees
  - \$900 for books
  - For schools where tuition and authorized fees are over the scholarship cap, students are liable for the difference.
- Type 7 – Capped at the **in-state tuition rate**
  - Pays full in-state tuition rate, fees, \$900 for textbooks
  - Selectee must attend a school where he/she qualifies for the in-state tuition rate. Selectees are not allowed to attend a higher cost institution and pay the difference.
- Professional Organization Scholarships

- Receiving a scholarship results in a contract
  - Once contracted you are Committed to completing your degree in the allotted time and accepting an Air Force commission after graduating
  - If you are a scholarship recipient and you decide to leave the program you may be required to pay it back or go active duty for one year as an enlisted troop at the grade you are given when contracted.
