Messaging (and) the Middle East: The politics of publishing in and about the region, and translation as communication



Patricia Billings is a publisher, editor, and consultant who specializes in translated and bilingual literature. Recently, she has served as editorial director of a series of novels and anthologies translated from Turkish into English, published by Milet Publishing. She co-founded Milet and was director of the company for 15 years, in London, Izmir, and Chicago, where she helped grow it into a leading publisher of translated and bilingual books, with a list of over 400 titles in 26 languages. Prior to Milet, she worked in Washington, D.C., with the International Organization for the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination, the Jordan Information Bureau, and the North American Coordinating Committee for NGOs on the Question of Palestine, where her jobs included communications, policy and media analysis, and advocacy. Patricia was also an editor at The Jordan Times newspaper in Amman.
