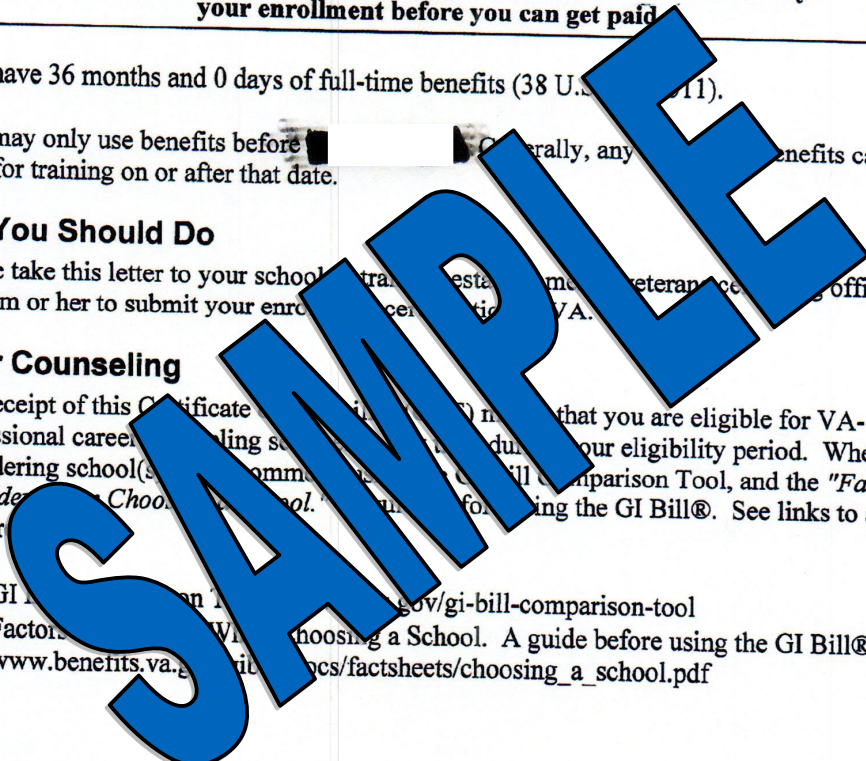

This certifies that you are entitled to benefits for an approved program of education or training under the Post-9/11 GI Bill (38 CFR 21.9590).

You must take this letter to your school. Your school must certify your enrollment before you can get paid (38 CFR 21.9700).

You have 27 months and 21 days of full-time benefits remaining (38 CFR 21.9550).
 You have no time limit to use your education benefits under the Post-9/11 GI Bill program (38 USC 3321).
 You're entitled to receive 100% of the benefits available for the Post-9/11 GI Bill program for training offered by an institution of higher education. Yellow Ribbon

Because you are in the National Guard or Reserve, you may also be eligible to participate in the Yellow Ribbon Program. The Yellow Ribbon Program allows schools to enter into an agreement with VA to provide additional financial assistance to individuals who are charged tuitions and fees that exceed the in-state maximum amount payable under the Post-9/11 GI Bill program. This benefit is only payable if the Post-9/11 GI Bill tuition and fee payment does not cover the full cost of your school's tuition and fees.

Note: Individuals on active duty are not eligible for this program until August 1, 2022. The Yellow Ribbon Program is not available at all schools. To determine if your school participates, or to receive a list of Yellow Ribbon Program participating schools, please visit
