Citizenship status does not affect eligibility.

Borrower can have only one emergency loan per academic year (Fall – Summer), have least a 2.5 cumulative GPA, cannot have past due balance on their account, cannot have a collection charge within the past two academic years, must be enrolled for the current semester, cannot have a late charge for a previous emergency loan within the past two academic years.(\$50.00 - \$600.00)
