Bios

Dr. Nicholas Bratcher serves as Director of Bands and Assistant Professor of Music at California State University, San Bernardino (CSUSB). There, he conducts the Symphonic Wind Ensemble, Chamber Winds, and teaches courses in conducting, music education, and courses in diversity in music studies.

Prior to his appointment at CSUSB, Bratcher held positions as Director of Bands at the University of Dubuque (Dubuque, IA) and Assistant Director of Bands at Savannah State University (Savannah, GA). Bratcher consistently works with composers, arrangers, and performing artists throughout the country. Projects with new compositions and wind literature are integral to his creative work. Bratcher is published in the GIA Teaching Music through Performance in Band book series. He is an active guest conductor, clinician, adjudicator, and performer throughout the United States and abroad.

Bratcher earned a Bachelor's Degree in Music and a Master of Arts in Music Education from Coastal Carolina University. He later earned the Doctorate in Music Education with studies in Conducting from the University of Georgia where he studied with Mary Leglar, John Lynch, and Mark Cedel, respectfully.

Sebastian Picazo graduated magna cum laude from Rancho Verde High School in the class of 2014, where he began studying and performing music with Honglac Hathuc and the award-winning Rancho Verde Crimson Regiment. Sebastian continued his music education with his enrollment at Moreno Valley College, where he studied with Barry McNaughton and earned his Associate's of Arts degree in Music. While at Moreno Valley College, Sebastian took part in the guitar ensemble where he became more frequently recognized for his performances and earned multiple awards. In 2016, he earned the Moreno Valley College Music Department Scholarship, and then went on to receive the 2017-2018 Moreno Valley College Student of Distinction Award and the CSUSB Music Department Scholarship upon his transfer in 2020. Currently, Sebastian is working towards finishing his Bachelor's Degree in Music and Guitar Performance at CSUSB under the direction of Professor Stuart Green.
