PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Office of Student Research is happy to announce a new partnership with the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship that will offer eligible undergraduate students the opportunity to earn money while conducting research with a faculty member.

The **Undergraduate Success Research Assistantship Program (USRA)**, funded by the <u>Learning Aligned</u> <u>Employment Program (LAEP)</u>, which the California Student Aid Commission offers, provides financial support to help ease their educational costs while gaining education-aligned, career-related employment. USRA funds students of all class and experience levels to work with faculty who need assistance on their own research projects. Students obtain valuable out-of-class experience, while faculty are able to hire Research Assistants (RAs) to get the help they need.

Students must check eligibility before they can participate. Placement is not guaranteed. Interested faculty must have submitted a request to the Research & Creative Activities Database if they need assistance identifying a student. Faculty who already have a student should encourage their student to complete the request form.

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be an undergraduate
- Have filed a FAFSA/CADAA for the 23-24 academic year.
- Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress and have financial need.
- All majors accepted.

- Earn \$20/hour
- Flexible work hours while working on campus
