



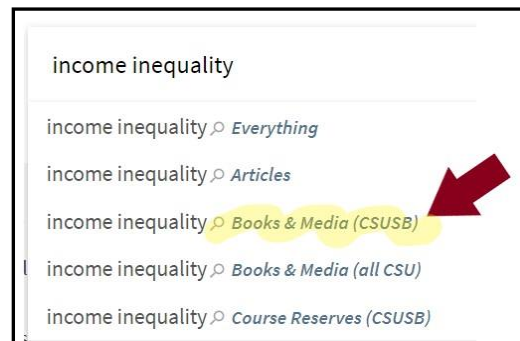
## Using E-Books

Effectively working with e-books requires awareness of three characteristics of the book: ownership, users, access.

### Finding E-Books

Use OneSearch > Books & Media (CSUSB) to find items available at CSUSB.

You can then limit to both books and available online.



### Understanding User Limits

Most frequently, you will see books with 1 simultaneous user (SU), 3 SU, unlimited, and some variations. If you exceed that number (you are the second person with 1 SU allowed), you will not be able to enter the book and read/download from it.

### Understanding Downloading Versus Read Only

Most e-books allow downloading at the chapter level. There are often limits on how many PDF pages allowed every 24 hours. Others have no limits to daily PDF downloads. A few, however, allow only reading and have no PDF download option.

### Owning Versus Subscribing

Some e-books the library has purchased; these titles will never disappear. However, other titles are available only through a subscription service or a pilot program. These items may disappear without notice at any time.

### Examples

- Forensic psychology Crichton [2<sup>nd</sup> edition] (access, unlimited, PDF)
- Black feminist thought Collins (owned, unlimited, PDF)
- Personality psychology student-centered approach (owned, 1 SU, PDF)
- Influence the psychology of persuasion Cialdini (access, unlimited, read only)
- Mindfulness and psychotherapy Germer (owned, 3 SU, PDF)
- Actor's secret Polatin (owned, 1 SU, read only)
