

Minor in Japanese & Certificate in Japanese Language and Culture

The Japanese program at California State University, San Bernardino provides students with an intermediate-advanced proficiency in the Japanese language: reading, writing, listening and speaking. It provides a broad knowledge of Japan through diverse academic courses, in areas such as: Japanese culture, including Japanese pop culture, topics such as manga, anime, video games, etc., Japanese business, Japanese society, and Japanese literature.





The goal of the Japanese program is to prepare students who will become professionals in a global society by helping them acquire sound Japanese language skills and a thorough understanding of Japanese culture and society.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

Students must meet general university admissions requirements.
