EAP APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must be a sophomore or junior and have a minimum overall and science **GPA of 2.75** or above.

In addition, the following course prerequisites must be completed before applying to the EAP:

One year of General Chemistry (with lab) CHEM 2100 & 2100L

One semester of Organic Chemistry (with lab) CHEM 2400 + 2400L

One semester of General Biology (with lab) BIO 2210 (lab included)

One semester of Calculus
Math 2210



3.5 YEAR PROGRAM

The 3.5-year Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) program has been approved by the ACPE making the College the **FIRST** in CA amongst 14 schools to offer this innovative program!



APPLICATION DEADLINE

Students can apply to the EAP as early as the prerequisites listed above are complete. The EAP application deadline is January 15th of the year prior to the intended year of matriculation.



EAP ACCEPTANCE

EAP students are responsible for completing the remaining program requirements for final acceptance to WesternU's PharmD program.

EAP APPLICATION PROCESS

EAP applications can be requested via email at bmachado@westernu.edu. EAP applications should be submitted to Ben Machado (bmachado@westernu.edu) with the following attachments:

- Unofficial college transcripts to verify completion of prerequisites
- Two references (linkage advisor/science faculty/pharmacist)
- Personal statement (can be located on the EAP application)



EAP ACCEPTANCE (CONTINUED)

EAP students are required to submit the primary pharmacy application (PharmCAS). EAP students also participate in enrichment experiences, including but not limited to:

- Service-learning and mentorship programs.
- Volunteer opportunities at pharmacies under the direct supervision of a pharmacist.
- Participation in community health fairs or on-campus events.
