In-text Citation Example

Lori Kido Lopez is an ethnographic researcher and an advocate for Asian American equity. In "Fan Activists and the Politics of Race in *The Last Airbender*," Lopez argues that "fans of *The Last Airbender* are able to transition from everyday fans to political activists" who employ the "language and culture of fandom itself" not only in service to the goal of making changes within the world constructed by the text, but also to effect "wider conversations about racial representations and Asian American identities" (432).

Quick Style Tips

- When introducing authors, use full names exactly as they appear in your source; subsequently, you may use an author's family name.
- Use **present tense** to discuss textual features and contexts:
 - Avatar's waterbending takes inspiration from the philosophy and flowing movements of Tai Chi.
- Use past tense for historical context:

 Taoist, Buddhist, and Confucian traditions influenced the Neo
 Confucianism of the Song dynasty.
